Popular Science.

Useful fire extinguisher.—Mr. Schlumberger recommends that a bottle of ammonia should be placed in each barrel of petroleum. On ignition, by accident or otherwise, the bottle would break and the ammoniacal vapours would at once extinguish the fire. Dr. Pietra Santa, proposes to apply this method to colliers' liable to fire-damp. Tanks filled with ammonia, would, it is said, stop the combustion, as it could not continue in an ammoniacal atmosphere.

How to use new files.—A new file should always be used with a light pressure until the very thin sharp edges are worn off, after which a heavier pressure may be used with much less danger of the teeth crumbling at the top or breaking off at the base. Every flut should keep a partially worn file to use first on chilled surfaces or gritty skin of castings, or in a weld where borax or similar fluxes have been employed, or in the glazed surface of saws after gumming.

Explosion Preventive.—M. Treve publishes in the "Moniteur Industriel" a plan for diminishing boiler explosions, which he points out—as has previously been shown—are due to leaving the boiler full of water, which by boiling parts with its air. M. Boutigny had previously proved that water in this condition is in the spheroidal state and liable to explosion. M. Treve advises the injection of air before reheating the water, and the use of a thermometer, which would indicate whether the vapor pressure is below that to be expected from the temperature of the water.

Sufficiently Dead Drunk.—"Dead-drunk" is described by savants of the Paris Biological Society to be a condition in which there is a proportion of one part of alcohol to 195 parts of blood in the circulation. Should the proportion ever come to be one part of alcohol to 100 of blood, death would ensue. This might happen, and in fact has happened repeatedly, where a very large quantity of alcoholic liquor is swallowed at one time and quickly. In ordinary drinking consciousness is lost, and with it the power to drink more, before the proportion of alcohol in the circulation becomes fatal.

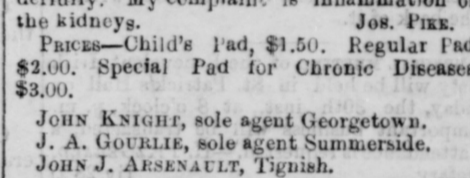
