WAR NEWS.

A GREAT GREEK VICTORY.

Turn in the Tide of Fortune.

GENERAL SMOLENSKI'S BRIGADE CONGRATULATED.

The New Ministry Well Received.

LONDON, May 1.—A despatch to the Times reports that Volo has surrendered to a force of Turkish cavalry.

ATHENS, May 1.—A telegram received here says that a great battle has been fought at Velesina between a Turkish force of 80,000 men and General Smolenski's brigade. The despatch says that the Turks were repulsed with enormous losses. It is announced that the Turks have been completely repulsed at Velesina. General Smolenski has asked the Crown Prince to congratulate the troops.

On the whole the new ministry is well received by the newspapers. It is composed of Premier and Minister of Marine—M. Ralli.

Demetrius Ralli, the new Premier and Minister of Marine, was the leader of the opposition. He has been Minister of Justice and Minister of the Interior and is well known as an able lawyer and orator. He is fifty years old and studied at the universities of Athens and Paris. After tomorrow's vote of confidence M. Ralli and Simoupolou will go to the Greek headquarters at Pharsalos. As soon as the new cabinet is formed the premier and the minister of war and marine will start for Pharsalos. The king has entrusted M. Delvaunis, the retiring premier, with full power to represent His Majesty during the formation of the new cabinet, and only insisted that M. Teotacki should enter the cabinet. The leaders of the opposition then went to parliament house, where a meeting of the opposition was held. The leaders afterwards had another conference, and drew up a list of ministers, which three of the leaders presented to the king. The names will be submitted to the legislative assembly to-morrow and a vote of confidence will be asked for. It is believed that M. Deligeorgis will be president of the chamber.

Admiral Canaris and M. Deligeorgis, as well as M. Setiropoulo, having declined portfolios, the new ministry will take on a composite character and rely for its support on a coalition of followers of M. Ralli and Triconpists.

NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

Able Speech by Mr. Powell.

The Preferential Scheme.

OTTAWA, May 1.—The debate on the tariff was continued yesterday afternoon. Among the speakers was Mr. Powell, of Westmoreland, who made an elaborate argument concerning the preferential resolutions. His contention was that the resolutions were bad in law, bad in principle, and a subterfuge for the purpose of deception. Mr. Powell showed that the treaty with Belgium and Germany provides that not only should these countries receive the same general tariff favors and privileges from the British Colonies as Great Britain receives, but that in no single article should England be preferred to Germany and Belgium. As a matter of

As a matter of fact, Belgium and many other countries had a lower tariff than Canada, and the tariff would be with one quarter off for a Canadian tariff, thus reduced, would be 14 per cent. and Germany's less than 10 per cent. If the Ministers did not propose to deal in subterfuge but intended to make some standard of their own on which to determine whether the foreign tariff was on the whole as favorable as the Canadian tariff. It would have been impossible for any self-respecting nation to have relations with a British nation on such terms. The three Ministers who had been questioned, did not give an explanation of the Government's position. Mr. Powell ventured the opinion that the resolutions if placed in a statute could not stand, but must be disallowed.

Mr. Powell's argument had been carefully prepared and presented in a clear and logical manner. The Liberal Conservative party, in caucus, decided yesterday that when the preferential resolutions are reached, in committee of the whole, an amendment will be proposed. The resolution giving the Ministers power to change the tariff whenever they shall decide that an improper combination exists, will be opposed directly if it is not withdrawn.


