

Business recommends flashing signal lights

Summerside Bureau of The Guardian... A six man coroner's jury brought in a verdict of accidental death resulting from a collision between a vehicle and a locomotive at a Kensington level crossing.

The jury also strongly recommended that all level crossings in Kensington be equipped with flashing light warning signals. Five witnesses were called by Crown Prosecutor, George R. McMahon before the jury retired and an autopsy was read by a body surgeon.

The witness who was called to testify was Charles Doughty, a Kensington housewife who lives just beside the crossing where the fatality occurred.

He testified that he saw the car on the side of the road and he went back to the vehicle when the train stopped.

The reserves are now at their highest level since the end of the war.

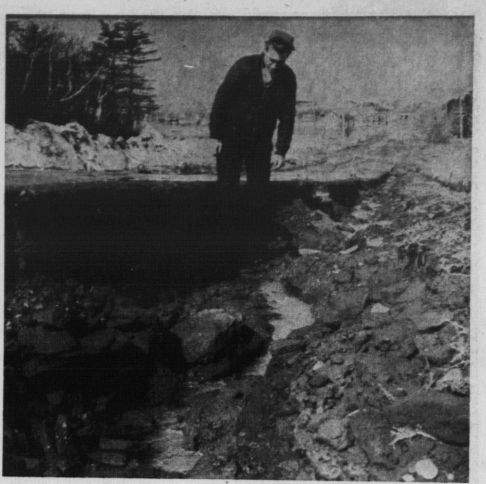

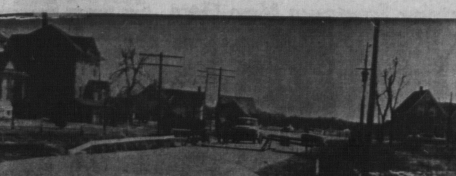

WASHINGTON (AP) - Government officials said Tuesday the National Aeronautics and Space Administration is looking into acceptance of furnished \$240,000 homes by seven U.S. astronauts.

The homes were offered by the Houston Home Builders Association and the astronauts' business adviser announced acceptance.

One government official asking not to be quoted by name, said the matter is entirely in the hands of NASA, and that the White House has not been consulted or taken any initiative in the case.
