RESOLUTIONS

At the Annual Meeting of the Maritime Federation of Agriculture held last week in Moncton, the following Resolutions were adopted.

DAIRY POLICY

Whereas the present floor price on butter has a stabilizing effect on the whole dairy industry and whereas it has the effect of benefiting the consumer in that it assures them a supply of butter at reasonable prices at all times

Resolved that we commend the Dominion Government for maintaining the floor price on butter and

Further resolved that

1. We urge the Federal Government to retain the present floor price of butter at 58 cents;
2. We suggest that the importation of dairy products that are in surplus be watched carefully, that no importations be permitted without consultation with Dairy Farmers of Canada, nor used indiscriminately to balance our national trade agreements;
3. We support any government program to promote increased consumption of all dairy products;
4. We are in full accord with the policy of the federal government to export surplus butter stocks to foreign countries wherever there may be a market;
5. We suggest that Dairy Farmers of Canada attempt to counteract, through advertising, the effect of

CANADIAN FARM LOAN BOARD POLICY

Whereas the Canadian Farm Loan Board Act would appear to be administered in a very cautious manner and

Whereas there is evidence to indicate that higher rates of interest are being charged than is necessary and

Whereas if the Board were doing a higher percentage of mortgage lending administration costs would be proportionately lower

Resolved that the C. F. A. press for an immediate revision of the Act and for a more liberal application of its terms.

PRICE SUPPORT POLICY

Whereas price support legislation is of value only if and when applied, and

Whereas the intent of the legislation is good but its application is on an indefinite basis both as to commodity and conditions

Therefore be it resolved that this meeting commend the Federation of Agriculture for its action in attempting to have price supports applied according to a known formula for designated products.

FEDERAL MARKETING LEGISLATION

Resolved that the Canadian Federation of Agriculture request the

Federal Government to amend marketing legislation to ensure that provincial marketing boards may make a levy in order to carry on operations involving interprovincial and export trade.

USE OF ESTROGEN

Whereas the use of estrogen has become a recognized method of expediting in the meat bird industry of the major agriculture countries of the world, and has been
