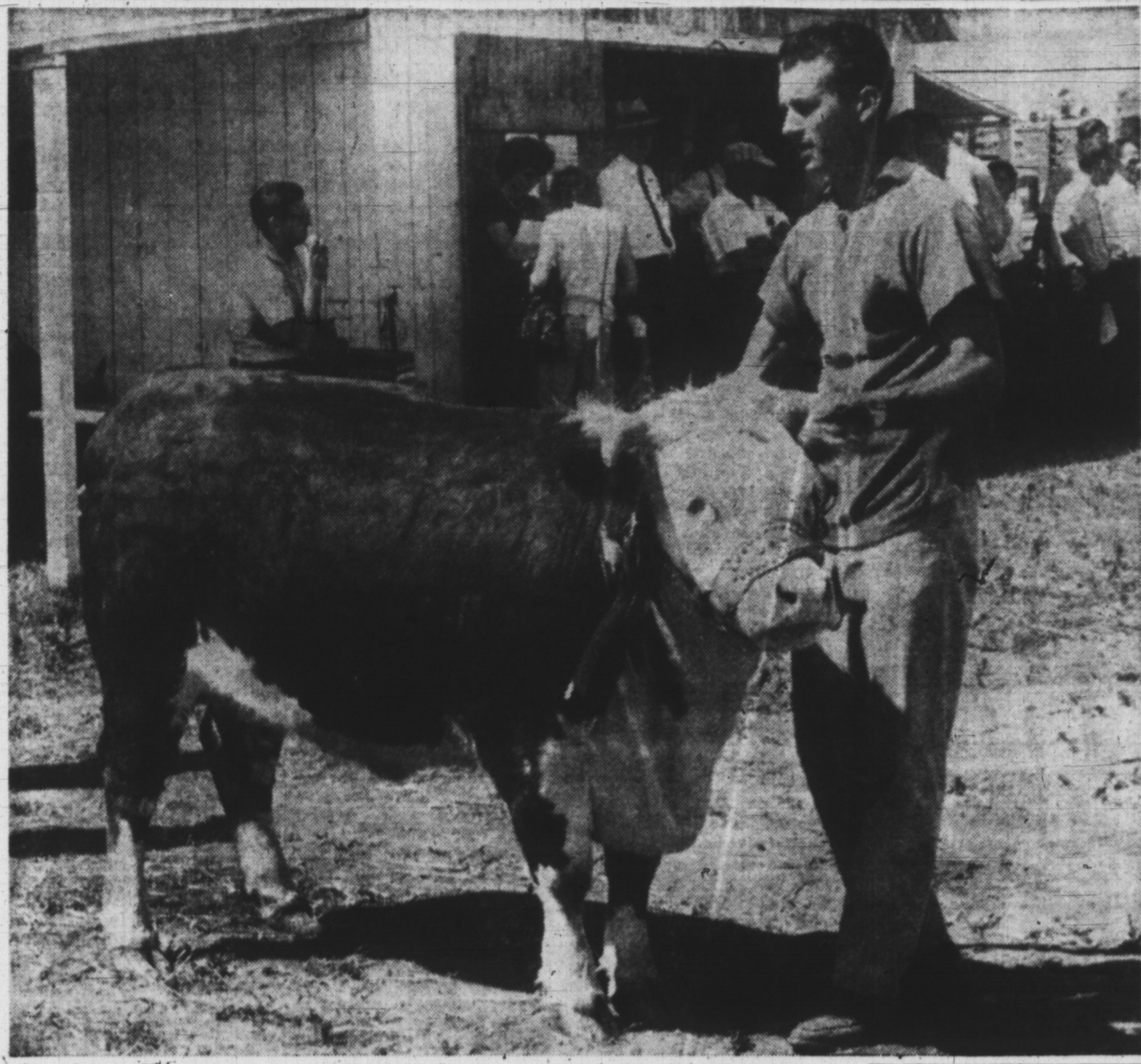
COVERS GROUND — The Tokyo - Osaka express train is scheduled at 103 m.p.h. average.

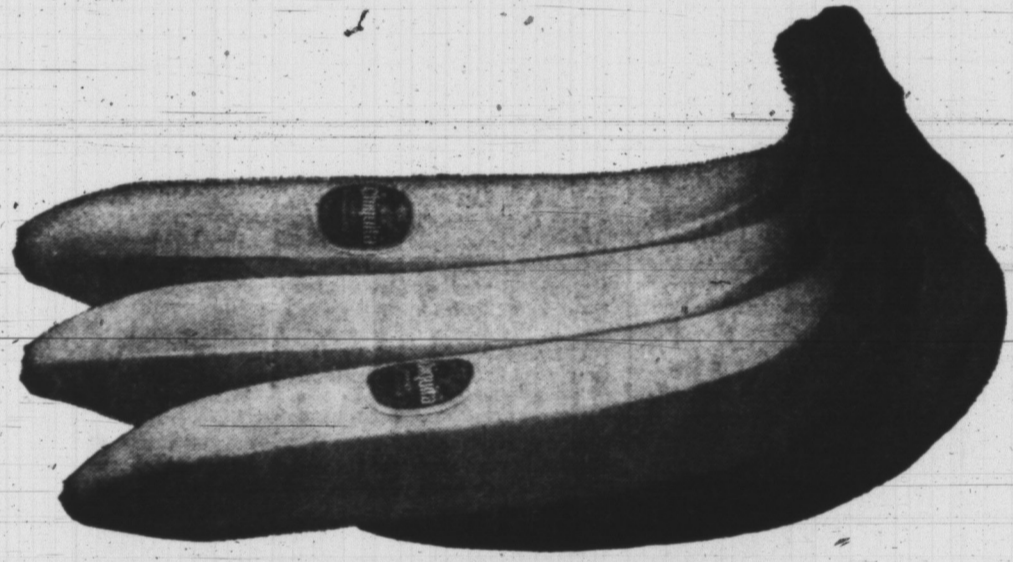
