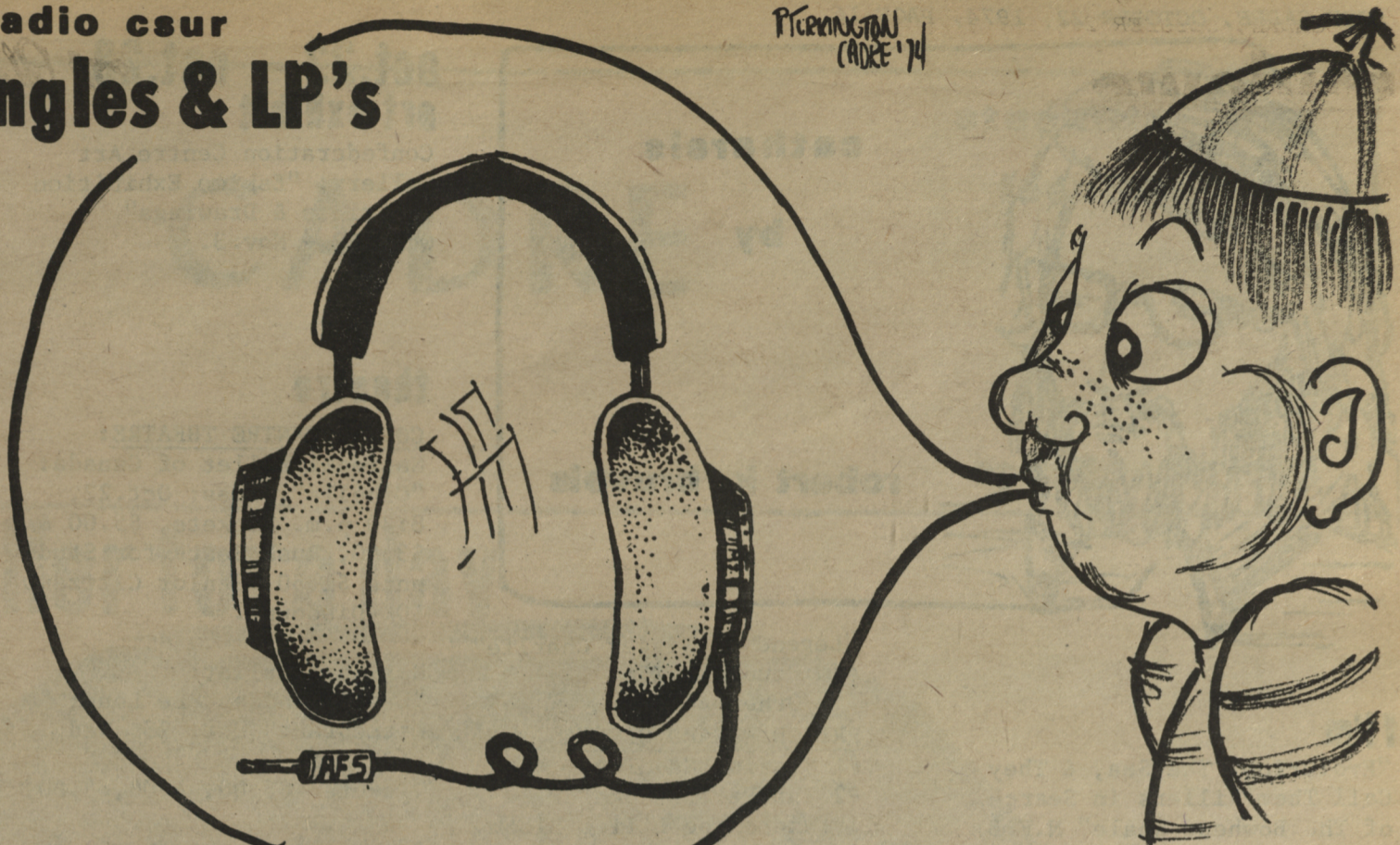

This week we decided to try the campus cuisine. On Wednesday night we arrived to sample the roast chicken supper. We were met at the door by the gracious host Peter Gabana, who admitted us. The first aspect of cafeteria dining that we noticed was the abundance of side dishes such as potato salad, cole slaw, meats, breads, milks etc.

The cafeteria was clean in appearance, but had the drab conformist atmosphere of most institutionalized cooking service. As we began the meal we were appalled by the lukewarm, runny "chicken with rice" soup or as we prefer to call it "rice without chicken" soup. The main meal in itself was filling and we must say it was not as tasteless as other cafeteria meals we had become accustomed to. Then came the dessert, that majestic masterpiece "gourmets
