Big Thoroughbred Farm Is Sold

LEXINGTON, Ky., Sept. 23 — (AP)—One of the biggest thoroughbred farm sales in several years was revealed with an announcement by P. A. B. Widener III that he had sold 605 acres of Elmendorf Farm.

largest transaction since the lands and horses belonging to the late Col. E. R. Bradley's Idle Hour farm were sold in 1946. While the price of the Idle Hour sales was not officially announced, it was believed to be around \$2,800,000. Elmendorf was purchased by Tinkham Veale II and Sam A. Costello, both of Cleveland, O., and also the breeding stock, including 31 broodmares, 30 foals of 1950 and three stallions, Roman, Unbreakable and Chance Shot. Widener, who says he will continue racing his colors, did not sell his racing stable.

Nude Woman Worth More, is Ruling

NEUWIED, British Zone of Germany, Sept. 23 — (Reuters) — Postal authorities here have ruled that — on paper — a nude woman is worth one mark (26 cents) more than a "dressed" one. Basing their decision on a regulation of the Rhineland Palatinate Bank, they are exchanging five-mark notes at full value only if the nude woman on the note has not been "defaced."
Only four marks are paid for the note if the woman has been painted over.
The five-mark notes, which show nude Europa riding on a meerkat-like bull, were printed in Britain. Many clergymen and others anxious about public morals have complained about the woman on them.

The late Mrs. MacLean had been in ill health for some time but had recovered sufficiently to resume her place in the home. Last spring she contracted a heart condition and was confined to her bed until she passed away.
She will be greatly missed in the home where she had received all the earthly care that loving hands could do for the betterment of her comfort and happiness, and now she is receiving the heavenly care in her Father's house of many mansions.

Mrs. MacLean was the youngest daughter of the late John and Elizabeth Ballen Jenkins. She was born in Mt. Albion, Lot 48, January 3rd, 1886, and was the last surviving member of a family of ten. On March 19th, 1899, she was united in marriage to James C. MacLean. They took up residence on the old MacLean homestead at Meadow Bank, West River, and to this union were born two sons and three daughters. Her husband predeceased her in 1934. Being born of Scottish parents, descendants of the Selkirk settlers who came to this Island on the ship "Folly", she was of a strong vigorous constitution and of Scottish Presbyterian faith which she carried with her into the United Church movement. The faithful visits of her pastor, Rev. M.K. Charman of Cornwall United Church were a constant source of joy and comfort to her.
The late Mrs. MacLean was a friend whom to know was to love; the doors of her home was always open to an extremely large circle of friends. Many will sigh for the touch of the vanished hand and long for the sound of the voice that is still. She never was too busy or weary to prepare a cup of tea, her great delight on many occasions. Her hospitality knew no bounds. As a neighbor she was most thoughtful and a great lover of her home and family. In every good word and work she lived to the full the principles of her faith.

There are left to mourn the fond memory of a loving and affectionate mother the following daughters: Mrs. Nell Ferguson, Bonshaw; Mrs. J. R. Griffith, Seattle, Wash.; Mrs. William Ling, Wheatley River; and John Franklin, on the old homestead. A son George C. MacLean, merchant at Winsloe, passed away last October, which was a shock she never fully recovered from. Besides those left to mourn her passing she leaves nine grandchildren and six great grandchildren to cherish her memory. Her funeral which was very largely attended was held from her home on Sunday, July 23rd and was conducted by her pastor, Rev. M.K. Charman who spoke comforting words to the bereaved. The Cornwall choir rendered her favorite 23rd Psalm and "Forever with the Lord". During the service Mr. Harry Hyde sang with much feeling "Beyond the Sunset" while Mrs. Stanley Newman presided at the organ. The many beautiful flowers and expressions of sympathy received testify to the high esteem in which she was held. The pall bearers were Stanley Hyde, Frank Boyle, Colin McPhail, Victor McPhail, Colin Murray and Gordon MacLean, all near neighbors of the deceased. She was laid to rest beside her departed husband in the beautiful cemetery at Cornwall to await the coming of Him who said "I am the resurrection and the life".

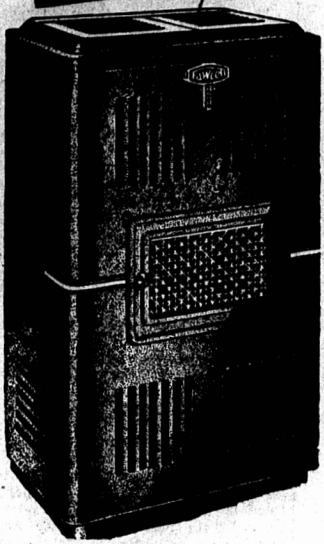
