Heat was fully restored to R. C. A. F. Station Summerside yesterday afternoon following the installation of a large power generating unit. It was flown in for the Central Heating Plant on Tuesday. The use of auxiliary power units has also enabled electricians to supply enough power to the homes in the Slemmon Park Housing development to enable the residents to use their furnaces and refrigerators.

FRANCE OPENS REACTOR PARIS (AP)—France put into operation Saturday its third and most powerful atomic reactor, "G-1" - designed to produce 33 pounds of plutonium a year. Plutonium is a man-made radioactive metal used in atomic bombs and reactors. G-1, at Marcoule in south central France, is a 40,000-kilowatt plant. Beginning in July it will be used to feed an experimental 5,000-kilowatt electric power plant.
