Durelle Near Title Contest

NEW YORK (AP) — Yvon Durelle, Canada's British Empire light heavyweight king, stands one victory and \$100,000 away from a title shot at world champion Archie Moore.

This Friday night he gets a crack at Tony Anthony in a battle of light heavyweight contenders at New York's Madison Square Garden.

If he can beat the tall, hard-hitting New Yorker in their twice-postponed return bout, the brawny fisherman-fighter will virtually clinch the championship affair for Toronto or Montreal.

Providing, of course, his manager can dig up sponsors for Archie's 100,000 guarantee.

Durelle, 28, and Anthony, 22, fought to a draw in Detroit last June. Anthony, then warming up for a title fight against Moore, was a big favorite. Tony was staggered by the Canadian and was lucky to escape with a draw. In his next fight, Anthony was flattened by Moore in the seventh round on Sept. 20.

RANKED FOURTH

This will be Anthony's first outing since the Moore debacle. He is now ranked as the fourth contender while Durelle, of Baie Ste. Anne, N.B., is ranked second.

Durelle, a vastly improved fighter in the last year, has an unbeaten streak of 12, including the draw with Anthony.

A hard hitter handicapped by a fragile jaw, Anthony has posted a 30-5-1 record, including 23 knockouts. His losses were all by
