Premier Bennett and his Social Credit government - a minority administration - was in office only seven months. At dissolution, Social Credit held 19 seats and the CCF 18. The Liberals held the balance of power with six members. Progressive Conservatives held two and Labor one. Two seats were vacant.

For the second time the electors will vote under the alternative voting system, which gives them a preference in marking their ballots. The polls open at 8 a.m. PDT 11 a.m. EDT and close at 8 p.m.

U. S. Steel Report CLEVELAND, (AP) - Steel Magazine heard "trade gossip" Sunday: The CIO - United Steelworkers would be satisfied with a pay increase of "around 10 cents an hour." The union is currently negotiating with the industry's management, and the metal-working journal quotes "market observers" in saying that much of a pay boost would jump the base price of steel from \$4 to \$5 a ton. Any revision in base prices would be made after the industry reaches an agreement on wages with the union, Steel says. In the face of possible price increases, the demand for steel continued undiminished, the magazine says. "Consumers continued to press or every pound of steel they can get. Producers' order books are filled through the third quarter on all the major products and, barring unforeseen cancellations, there is little prospect any substantial open tonnage will be available over the summer." Mills operated last week at 100 per cent of the United States' rated capacity, a drop of half a point.
