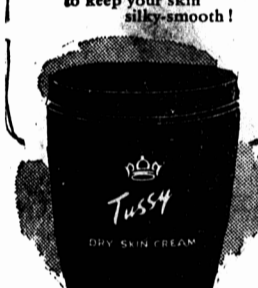

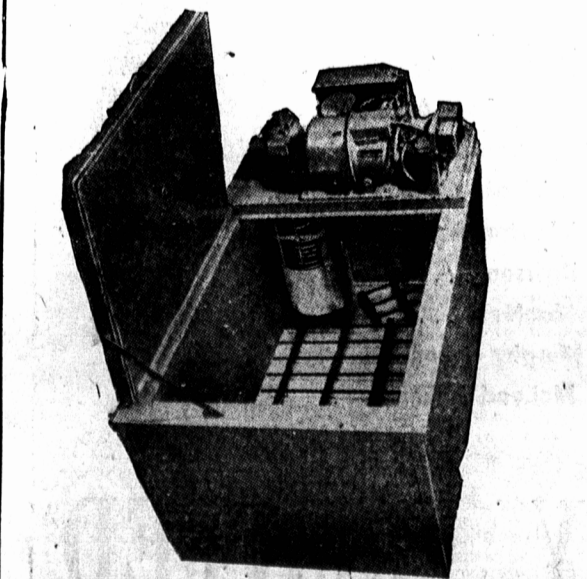

The Summerside two-year street-paving program has been completed, and because of the need for economy at present other streets needing paving will probably have to wait for a while. The town saved considerable money last winter because, due to the unusual season, snow-removal was virtually non-existent. It begins to look, however, now that spring has turned the corner, as if our older pavements are going to break up a bit more than usual. This means, of course, that extensive patching will have to be done, and the money saved in the winter may have to be spent during the spring and the early part of the summer.

There is a similar story to tell about the highway from Summerside to Charlottetown. While the new stretches are holding up well, the old pavement is crumbling in a good many places. With the emphasis now on construction of the new Trans-Canada highway, it is natural to expect that the old route from Summerside to the capital city will suffer some neglect. As long as the old pavement can be made passable by patching, the situation will be still in hand, but if the pavement deteri-

R.A.F. Planes

These big aircraft are somewhat similar in design, but are larger than the Lancaster aircraft that are used for similar training purposes at the Summerside station. The Lincoln planes are predominantly black in color, but are painted grey on top, and the tail and wingtips are painted in a brilliant red. About 50 men from the R. A. F. have made this long flight as part of a specialist navigation training course, and are visiting Summerside to exchange views with their R.C.A.F. counterparts, and to give

their navigators training on long range navigation. A similar course from the Summerside station recently visited the home base of these British airmen. While here they hope to do a trip up Hudson Bay way to try out their radar equipment in that area. Next month they will do a trip to Resolute Bay from Marmby, England, and while staying there for two or three days will be making flights over the North Pole. Wing Commander Burnett left Canada in 1937 to join the Royal Air Force. In 1950 he returned on a month-long visit during which he visited many parts of Canada. In referring to the trip the big planes had made from England to Summerside he said they had had a "most excellent trip". The visiting airmen were welcomed on their arrival by the com-
