In his latest talk Wednesday the Liberal Farmer Candidate in Queens closed in nursery rhyme fashion listing a number of things the Liberals have done and that Liberals would do again—"Heaven forbid!"

One of these was that "Liberals have set up Marketing Boards and they will do it again." Let us remind him that in the case of Island Potatoes he would not have to do it again.

Our Potato Marketing Board is still with us just as the Marketing Board for Island Potatoes being shipped off the island. As far as marketing is concerned it has no authority whatsoever. Its chairman has consistently refused to attend farmers' meetings to give a report or to get our suggestions.

It is merely a sham, set up by the Liberals and carried on by the Conservatives to forestall the establishment of an effective Potato Marketing Organization. This Province which during the current session could have taken advantage of several Government initiatives on the world market and brought additional revenue of possibly seven million dollars in our farmers and business people.
