

# Los Angeles Dodgers Begin Winning Contests

John Roseboro, facing Juan Marichal for the first time since their fight last season, hit a three-run inside-the-park homer that ignited Los Angeles Dodgers to an 8-4 exhibition victory over San Francisco Sunday.

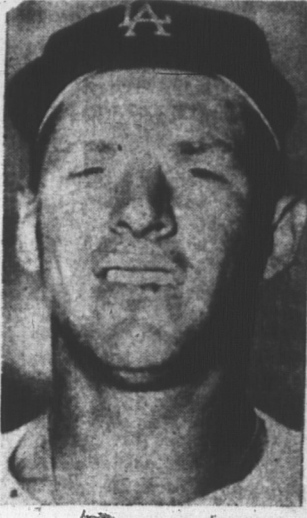
The Dodger catcher and Giant pitcher hadn't met on the field since last Aug. 22 when Marichal hit Roseboro on the head with a bat.

Roseboro came to bat in the second inning after Ron Fairly and Jim Lefebvre singled. With a 2-2 count, Roseboro smashed a liner which bounced over right fielder Jesus Alou and went for a home run.

In all, the Dodgers wrapped Marichal for five runs and seven hits in five innings.

Glen Beckert singled in the sixth run and Ron Santo drove in the winner on a sacrifice fly in the eighth inning as Chicago Cubs edged California Angels 3-1.

Five of the Cub runs were earned as the Angels committed five errors.
