



Cassius Clay To Egypt; Will Fight Again In Eng.

LONDON (AP) — Cassius Clay flew to Egypt Tuesday at the invitation of President Nasser and said he might be back within two months for another money-making defence of his world heavyweight title in Britain.

The opponent he mentioned was Karl Mildenberger of West Germany, the European champion.

As Clay left it was clear that boxing and closed-circuit television officials were eager to repeat the glittering financial success of his title defence against Henry Cooper in London Saturday.

That fight grossed \$1,200,000, including closed circuit television rights.

Clay's share reportedly was around \$280,000.

Promoter Harry Levene, who staged Saturday's fight, confirmed that a Clay-Mildenberger fight in Britain is under discussion.

CAN TELEVISION FIGHT

He said such a fight could be beamed direct to the United States via the Early Bird Satellite and to the whole of Europe.

Clay has the prospect of making monumental earnings in Britain, with no restrictions on taking the money back to America.

A spokesman at the British treasury said: "Clay is in the non-resident entertainer. There is no restriction on importing goods or services from America."

Before leaving for Egypt Clay said, "I don't have to go before the American draft board for a

couple of weeks and I'm tired. That's why I am gratefully accepting this invitation."

Neither Clay nor anyone else would nail down any definite plan or date for a fight against Mildenberger.

MENTIONS ALTERNATIVE

Clay talked to reporters at his hotel and at the airport here about the possibility of fighting Mildenberger. But he added that his next opponent might be the winner of the coming fight between Doug Jones and Ernie Terrell, the WBA champ, June 26 at Houston.

En route to Cairo, Clay's plane stopped at Frankfurt where he met Mildenberger, the 28-year-old European champion.

When they squared off in sparring stance at the airport, Clay said, "Why, he's a south-

paw. The only worry I have is that."

Reporters asked Clay about the fight and he motioned toward the German boxer and said, "Would he have the nerve to fight me?"

"Certainly," said Mildenberger when he caught the meaning of Clay's question.

"I thought I was the prettiest fighter in the world," said Cassius. "But I see you're pretty too. That's how I can tell he's a good fighter. No marks."

Atlanta Braves Lack Pitching

The Milwaukee, oops Atlanta Braves could possibly be a threat in the league-winner or could even be that themselves but for the fact that they are embroiled in the bitterest battle to take place in the world of sport for some time in their fight to remain in Atlanta.

They are also a real mystery team—as they have some of the best personnel in the league under contract, but also seem to be missing the key men when the beginning of the season rolls around. Everyone knows that the Braves can score runs but unfortunately other teams—also—manage to put them out three-times an inning by times and that is bad news for "Brave supporters."

The lack of good pitching has kept the Braves from being at the top of the National League at this moment and it is only too obvious that they would not be in sixth place with a 49-21 record, 7 1/2 games behind the Giants, if they had a few competent moundmen.

The Atlanta staff could be called spotty for it is good in spots. Tony Cloninger 24-11 last year, Ken Johnson (16-10) and Wayne Blasingame (16-10) give the Braves three starters but so far this season that is all they have been. The Braves had only four complete games by starters in their first 30 and even in this day of relief aces, this is a bad mark.

Dennis LeMaster who had arm troubles last season appears as if he has shaken the problem and he is 4-2 so far this year. In the bullpen the Braves have southpaw Billy O'Dell to give them some semblance of relief pitching but they are badly in need of a good righthander to balance the attack.

GOOD INFIELD

Apart from the pitching the Braves are very strong defensively. Catcher Joe Torres is rated as the best signal caller in the business today. Lee Thomas was acquired from the Boston Red Sox to reinforce the first base spot. Veteran Ed Matthews is still good for duties in the hot corner but he is not a regular there under the system the craft manager Bragan is utilizing.

Young Woodie Woodward, who plays either second base or shortstop has hit his way into the starting lineup and he is proving his worth in gold. If he plays at second the Braves still have the starry young shortstop, Dennis Menke on hand and if Bragan elects to play Woodward at shortstop then Menke moves to third.

This business of having a roster containing players who can play a variety of positions well is an excellent one, as almost anyone can be given a rest if it is needed. The Braves are certainly loaded as far as replacements go.

In the outfield they are so deep that they have to keep Rico Carty, a .330 hitter in his rookie season in 1964, on the bench. Philippe Alou, Henry "Hank" Aaron and Mack Jones provide the Braves with the most powerfully hitting outfield in the majors. The Braves last season hit 196 runs last year, high in the league, but they only managed to end up in fifth spot, too close to the second division for comfort.

The Braves also have something else going for them in the person of manager Bob Bragan, who is noted as one of the best managers around. He has already transformed his club into a hit and run team and if he had the pitching, the Braves could take the works. As it is they will end up about fifth again.

Football, Hockey Are Offering Equal Bonuses

WINNIPEG (CP) — The Winnipeg Football Club has done some arithmetic and concludes that Canadian Football League players do as well as those in the National Hockey League in collecting bonus money.

The NHL bonus plan this spring provided \$189,000 for a maximum of 21 games, or \$9,000 a game. Last fall the CFL plan provided \$237,200 for a maximum eight games or \$28,400 a game.

On an individual basis each of 18 players on a first-place NHL club that won the Stanley Cup in a maximum 14 games would have received \$5,000. This works out to \$357.14 a game.

Each of 32 players on a first-place Western Football Conference team that won the Grey Cup would have got \$2,850 or \$712.50 a game for a maximum of four playoff contests.

Even if an NHL player appeared in the lowest possible number of playoff games—eight—his per-game share of \$625 would compare with \$950 for the WFC minimum playoff total of three games.

—Broken down, the bonus plans work this way:

Western Football Conference —\$9,600 to the first-place team; \$12,800 to each semi-finalist; \$25,600 to each finalist; \$40,000 to the Grey Cup victor, \$24,000 to the loser.

National Hockey League—\$27,000 to the first-place team; \$13,500 to the second-place team; \$9,000 to the third-place team; \$4,500 to the fourth-place team; \$27,000 to each of the semi-final winners, \$13,500 to the losers; \$36,000 to the Stanley Cup champion, \$18,000 to the loser.

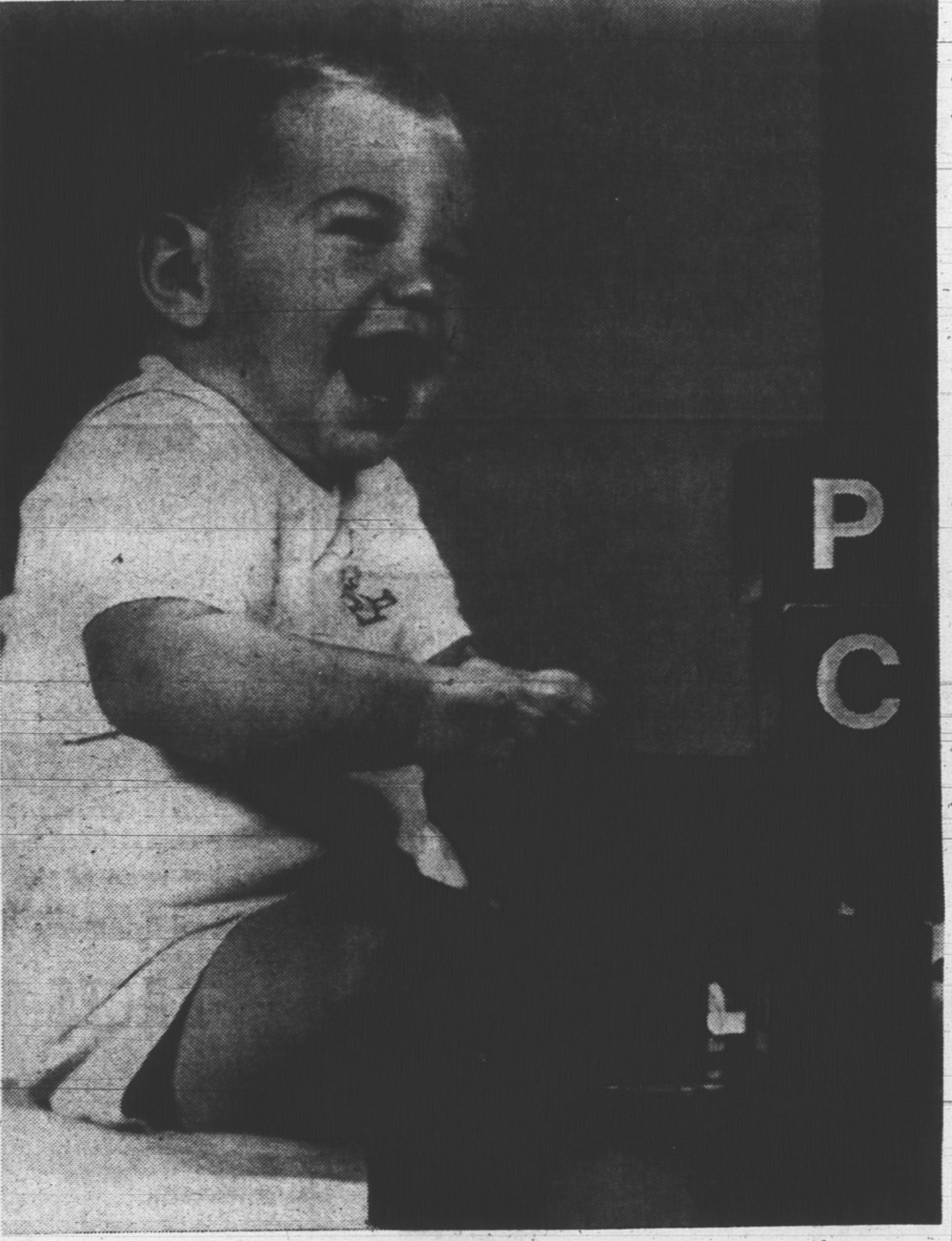
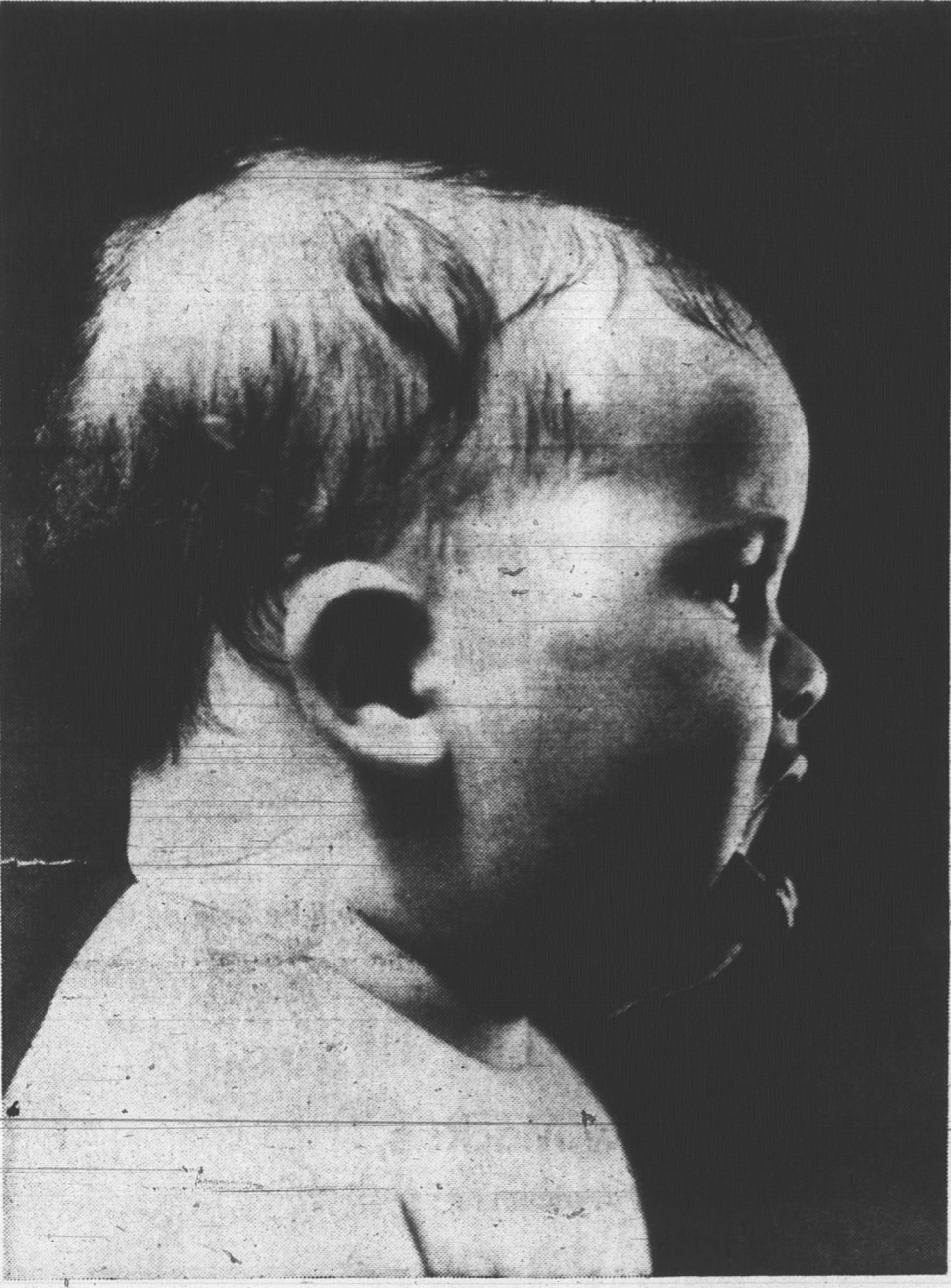
