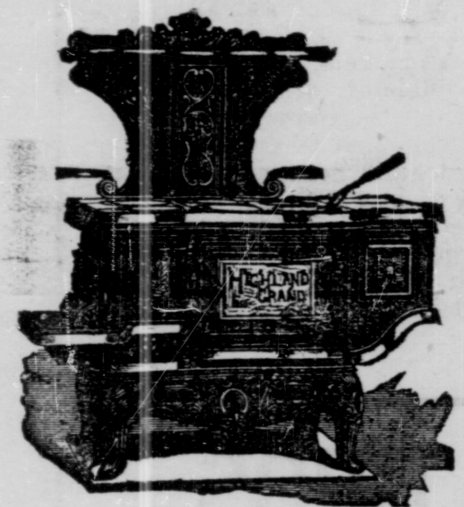

WINNIPEG LETTER.

Political Excitement in Manitoba the Conservatives Victorious.

Political excitement which has waxed strongly in this Province during the past few months, is now decidedly on the wane. This is especially noticeable on the streets of Winnipeg this morning, and the causes are so evident that he who runs may read, and does read in the results of the recent Provincial bye-elections in Manitoba as well as in the temper of the vast majority of the political meetings now assembling that the voice of the Prairie Province, as it will be recorded on the 7th inst., will prove an emphatic verdict against the record and even more against the methods of the aggregation who have lately vacated the ministerial benches at Ottawa.

As your readers are doubtless aware, the entry of Hon. Hugh John Macdonald into the arena of Federal politics became the occasion for the reconstruction of the Provincial Government in this province, which, with the appointment to the Lieut.-Governorship of Col. McMillan, the Opposition member for Centre Winnipeg, has caused the opening of four constituencies, viz: South and Centre Winnipeg, the constituencies of Premier Macdonald and Col. McMillan, respectively, Morris, the constituency of Hon. Colin Campbell, who has just appealed for re-election on his acceptance of the Attorney-Generalship, and the constituency of Woodlands where Premier Roblin is likely to be unopposed when he appeals to his constituents as Premier and President of Council.

That the trend of public opinion in local politics might be demonstrated beyond all doubt as flowing in favor of the Macdonald government and their nine months record, the first of these constituencies chosen to be tested were Morris and Centre Winnipeg, the former of which the Liberals, as represented by the Manitoba Free Press, "was only carried and could only have been carried by Hon. Mr. Campbell because his opponent last December was an invalid at the time of the election and was not a resident of the constituency. As for Centre Winnipeg, it has always been a grit stronghold, and even after the writs were issued for the present contest that party pretended to believe that the Conservatives would allow a Liberal to be elected by acclamation. The electors in Morris took place last Saturday, and resulted in the Attorney General increasing his majority of last year by nearly 10, and in his opponent saving his deposit by a bare 20 votes.

In Centre Winnipeg, where the local opposition have used all known and many hitherto unknown devices to hold the seat, the result has been the conversion of Col. McMillan's 115 majority of last year into the handsome majority for Mr. T. W. Taylor, the Conservative member elect, of over 150.

The constituencies of South Winnipeg and Woodlands are not to be opened before the Dominion elections, but they are admittedly easier wins for the local government than either of those above mentioned.

Did these bye-elections for the local legislature of Manitoba merely the approval of these two constituencies of the present local government it would hardly be worth while bringing them to the notice of the electors of P. E. I., but as a matter of fact they mean very much more. In these elections the Liberal party threw down the gauntlet from the first on Federal issues; for this they had two very good reasons: First, they do not now disguise from themselves the fact that the name of Greenway and the Greenway government, with its record of secret railway deals, stuffed voters' lists and extravagant expenditures stinks in the very nostrils of the electorate, and that the short record of the McDonald Government as one that is living and has lived up to its promises is unassailable. The second reason, and probably the more potent of the two, is the necessity felt by the present Federal Government of using every breath of wind to secure if possible the election of Clifford Sifton and the defeat of the future Conservative leader, Hugh John. The defeat of one of Mr. McDonald's late colleagues was rightly felt by the Siftonian organization to be a move the execution of which must have a telling effect upon the result of the Federal contest in Brandon; while the retention of Centre Winnipeg by a reduced majority could, by the usual grit sophistries be dangled before the eyes of the electors of Brandon as a "great Liberal victory," and an indication of the "flowing tide."

But the Liberal party reckoned, as it has often done before, without its host. The turning of these elections upon Dominion issues proved to be the greatest boomerang the Liberal party managers could have

projected. The Conservatives, feeling that they had much more than a fighting claim, went in to win; and what was most potent of all the electors of these two constituencies were proud to be the first in Canada to show in unmeasured terms their disapproval of the Sifton-Tarte-Blair-Davies Administration and its record of scandals and broken promises.

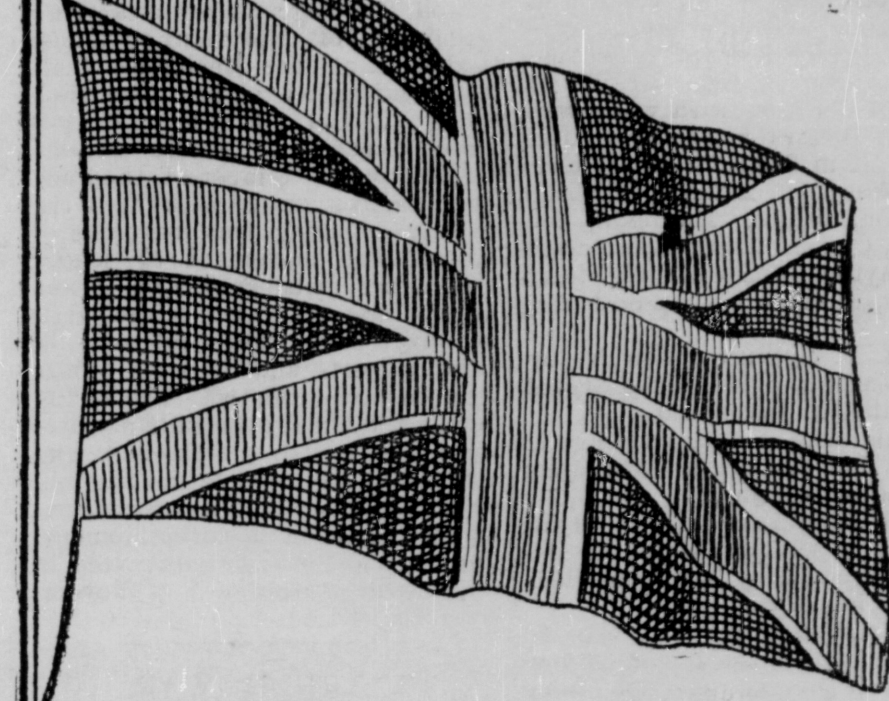
