FIRST R.C.A.F. CASUALTY OF KOREAN WAR

An R.C.A.F. fighter pilot with the U.S. air force in Korea, Sqdn. Ldr. A. R. (Andy) MacKenzie, of Montreal is reported missing on operations in Korea, where he has been on exchange duty. Commanding officer of No. 441 fighter squadron stationed at North Lufkinham, Eng., the 32-year-old pilot was the first R.C.A.F. casualty of the Korean War. A D.F.C. winner during the Second World War, he was credited with shooting down 8½ enemy planes. He is the 13th Canadian to go to Korea on an exchange basis for combat experience.

Gingerbread Cup Cakes

Combine ¼ cup melted shortening and 1¼ cups molasses and add 1 beaten egg. Stir until well blended.
