OSAKA, Japan, May 8—A gorgeously decorated lacquer cabinet, representing 100 years work by master carvers, will be presented to the Prince of Wales during his visit to this city.

The cabinet contains 54 panels depicting Japanese scenes and customs as represented by the Jull wara or fifteenth century period. The doors are decorated on the exterior and dances of the period on the interior.

A set of four silk embroidered hangings also will be given the royal visitor as a token of the city's esteem. These hangings are nine feet by seven, and reproduce floral works of a celebrated master in favor during the fifteenth and three following centuries.

Little Entente Proposes An Adjournment

Member of Russian Delegation Goes to Moscow to Consult Soviet Committee and Reply Delayed—Further Difficulties Expected

GENOVA, May 8—It was asserted here tonight that the little Entente, in view of the complications that have arisen over the memorandum presented by the Allies to the Russians, contemplated proposing adjournment of the economic conference until the problems which now are unsettled can be taken up with some probability of successfully ironing them out. This plan is especially supported by Dr. Eduard Benes, the Czecho-Slovak foreign minister.

Old Age Pensions Motion Adopted

OTTAWA, May 5.—Without debate the House of Commons adopted a motion by Dr. J. E. Fontaine (Lib. Hull) that "in the opinion of this House the Federal Government should consider the advisability of devising ways and means for the establishment of a system of old age pensions in Canada."

Remains of Pte. Bernard T. Fitzsimmons of the A. E. F. who was killed in action on April 20th, 1918, were forwarded to his old home in Montrose, accompanied by an American sergeant. The funeral took place on Sunday, April 23rd, and was very largely attended.

Memorial service for AOTAOIOTT A military escort under the direction of Lieut. A. E. B. Murphy M. C., paid a last tribute to their fallen comrade and added a more than ordinary touch of solemnity to the sad occasion. The pall bearers were Pte. G. Marchbanks, Pte. Claude Kinch, Gr. G. A. Roody, Pte. Henry Bernard, Pte. S. Brown and Pte. E. Harly with Sgt. J. Diamond acting as N. C. O.

The services at the Sacred Heart Church at Alberton were conducted by Rev. T. Campbell, a full choir being in attendance. Father Campbell also officiated at the grave.

Pte. Fitzsimmons, who was thirty four years of age at the time of his death, was a son of Michael Fitzsimmons of Montrose. He was a graduate of St. Dunstan's University and during his course took a prominent part as a student and an athlete. After spending some years in the U. S. A., he was one of the first to volunteer his services in behalf of the great cause of liberty in the world war. He was a young man of sterling qualities, who endeared himself to his comrades in peace and war by his many attributes. To his aged and respected father and to his brothers and sisters it shall be a great solace to know that the country and cause for which he willingly gave his life were not unmindful of his sacrifice or their sorrow when they reclaimed from its war torn sanctuary his mortal remains and, far from the scene of his supreme sacrifice, laid them to rest beside the grave of his beloved mother in the peace and quiet of his native cemetery.
