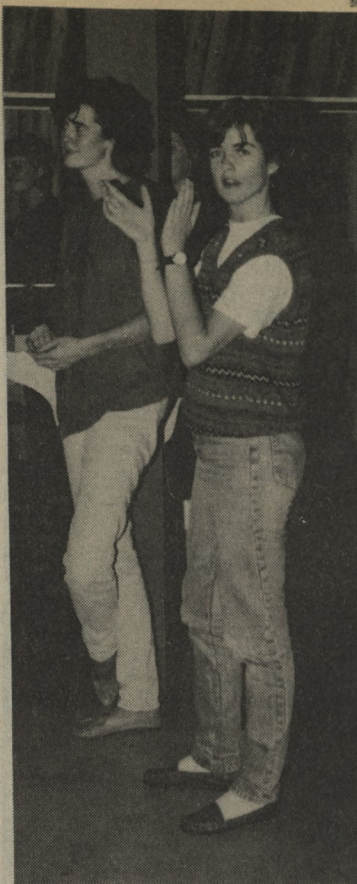


Job Fair '89
