NEW YORK, July 10—News generally this morning is better except that the heat continues high in various sections of the country. Business new, however, shows an improvement. The French Government received a vote of confidence by a large majority and Great Britain is cutting her fleet in the Mediterranean. Both Mr. Green, President of the American Federation of Labor, and Mr. Lewis are reported to have assured the President to take place now. Strike value of Lehman Corporation as of June 30 was \$119.25 against \$93.98 a year ago. In view of the action of yesterday's market and overnight news, we would look for a better market today and would favor Consolidated Edison, Niagara Hudson Power, Electric Bond and Share, Mohawk Hudson Second Preferred, Loews, General Motors, Associated Dry Goods, Federated Department Stores, Standard Oil of N. J., and Con-

tinental Oil.

MONTREAL, July 10—Strength and activity of the Canadian Car issues in recent sessions has attracted considerable street attention and in the absence of any developments suggesting immediately imminent equipment orders from the railways, has been associated with the company's German war claim. It will be recalled that early in June announcement was made that the German-American mixed claims commission had reversed a 1932 decision which absolved Germany of responsibility for the New Jersey munitions disaster in war time. Since that time representatives of the claimants and the American government have travelled to Germany for the purpose of negotiating on the invitation of the Government of that country.

MONTREAL, July 11—Bank clearings for 29 leading cities of the Dominion totalled \$448,637,890 for the week against \$323,468,117 for corresponding week of last year, a gain of 38 per cent.

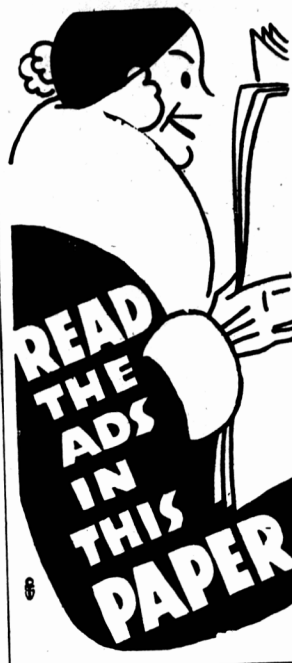
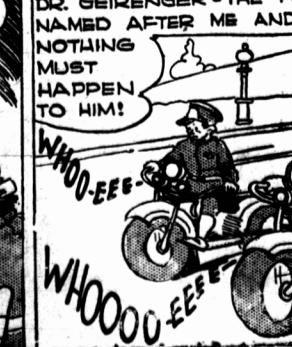

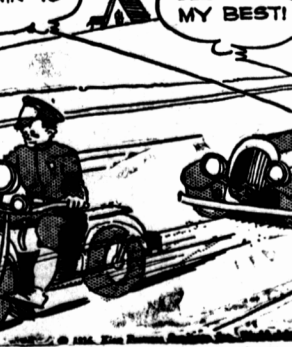
