Champs Are Declared In N.B. Tourney

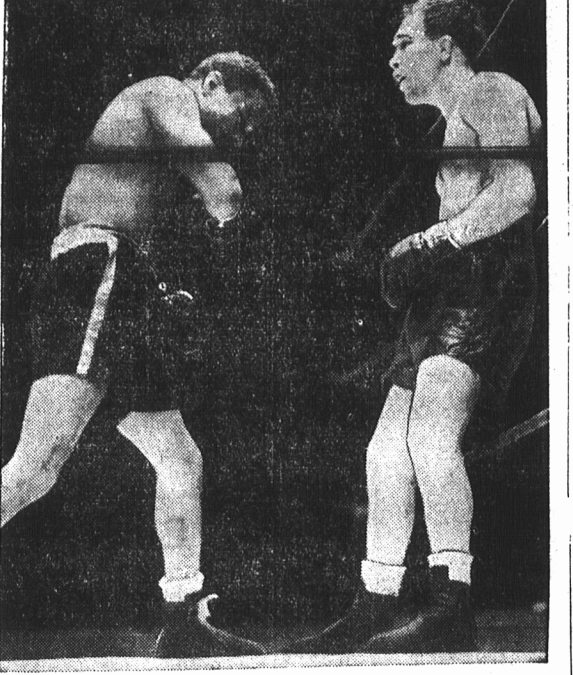

Leslie Regains Maritime Title With Two Round K.O. Over George Graham

Big George Leslie of Souris, rallying after losing his first round by wide margin, Saturday night regained the Maritime heavyweight boxing title as he scored a technical kayo victory over champion George Graham at Murray Harbor after 46 seconds of fighting in the second round. Down three times from smashing left hand wallop and suffering from a bad cut over the left eye, Graham saw his title vanish as his seconds hurried the towel into the center of the ring. It was a wise move. Graham was staggering around the ring with no defence left and might have suffered permanent injury if the referee had not allowed to continue. But it was a sudden finish to a scrap that started out in a manner that looked as if Graham would retain his title. Throughout the first round the titleholder landed rights and lefts to Leslie's face with telling effect. Leslie was hanging on and clinching at every opportunity throughout the session. But a hard left, the hardest punch Leslie has ever thrown in an island ring, at the start of the second beat, started Graham on his downfall. He was game enough after that, but could cope with an opponent that outweighed him by 17 pounds, weights being announced as Leslie 202 and Graham 185. But if the fans were disappointed in the quick ending of the main event they saw a semi-final that stole the show. It was a fight between two of the best fighters in the main event, after assimilating loads of punishment from the second to the eighth round captured the junior light heavyweight championship of the island by knocking out Dannie Mullins of St. Peter's after one minute and 59 seconds of fighting in the tenth and final round. Seemingly on the way to defeat as Mullins hit him continually with a hard overhand right for six consecutive rounds and suffering from a cut over the left eye—Mooney, absorbing punishment like a sponge soaks water—started his winning rally in the eighth. Catching Mullins coming in with a vicious right, Mooney saw his opponent hit the deck for a seven count. Mullins was up without a count but had hardly regained his feet when he hit the deck for nine; up he came again only to be knocked out once more and this time it was final—the fight was over and Mooney had completed the most sensational and game comeback ever seen in a local ring. Jimmy Allen, giving away nearly twenty pounds in weight, lost a heart-breaking decision to "Bomber" Shepherd in the other fight on the card, a five rounder. Scoring heavily with a left jab as Shepherd continually carried the fight to him, Allen according to the writer won three rounds but the judges decision saw the verdict go to the Canadian boy. The fans had seen both boys mixing it freely from the opening zong.

Victorias Send Series Into Fourth Game With 10-inning 9-7 Victory

In as tense and exciting diamond struggle that has ever been witnessed, here Sporting Club Victorias yesterday jumped back into a contending position in the intermediate play off position as they scored two runners in the 10th inning to give them an 9-7 victory over the Dominions in the third game of the best-out-of-five playoff series. Streeter Will Defend Title At Ashburn

HALIFAX, Aug. 27—(CP)—Their appetites for tournament play whetted by the Canadian Open held earlier this month at Saint John, almost a hundred Maritime golfers will set out Tuesday over the Halifax Ashburn Club course in quest of the Maritime Amateur Golf Championship. For most of the entrants this tournament means the first test of that "new polish" which they acquired by watching the top-flighters in action at Riverside. Many of them competed with McSpren, Guldahl and co. over the tough, par-70 course near Saint John. Ashburn's par-67 usually withstands the onslaughts of the amateurs, and it should remain uncreaked this week. A shower of dry weather has left the fairways parched and brown. Almost constant sprinkling, however, has kept the greens smooth and fast. Tournament officials said tonight they had received an additional flood is expected before tomorrow night's deadline. Among those already entered is last year's tri-province titleholder, Percival Streeter of Saint John Riverside. His opponent, E. D. Thomson, who forced Streeter to the 37th hole in last year's final round, is not expected to compete. Pete Kelly of Charlottetown, this year's New Brunswick-Prince Edward Island champion, has sent in his entry. Kelly won the Maritime two years ago. Frank Mickle, of Halifax Gorsebrook, who celebrated his return to tournament golf this year by winning the Nova Scotia amateur title, is expected to file his entry tomorrow. Twelve Maritime professionals have sent in their entries for the Maritime open championship, consisting of 72 holes of medal play on Thursday and Friday. Jimmy Rimmer of Ashburn, who pressed the leaders in the Canadian open, is a hot favorite to retain his open title on his home course. Rimmer has been known to go around Ashburn in 63, four under par. The 36-hole qualifying round in the amateur tourney will be played on Tuesday, and the survivors will get down to match play on Wednesday. The finals are slated for Friday.

Miss Jacobs breezed through Mary Hardwick 6-2, 6-2 after Miss Marble conquered England's best, Kay Stammers, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4. Two victories coupled with two wins in the three matches played Saturday, gave the United States the required four triumphs in the seven match series. In a third singles encounter today Valerie Scott of England defeated Mrs. Sarah Palfrey Fabryan 6-3, 6-4. The United States team finally wound up with a lead of five matches to two when Mrs. Fabryan and Miss Marble teamed to defeat Mrs. Freda James Hammerley and Miss Stammers, 7-5, 6-2, and close out the series. After roaring across this salt lake bed twice Saturday, he finished the old five kilometre, 10 kilometre and 10 mile marks look slow by comparison, the big Briton began planning for the future and a goal of 400 miles an hour.
