Farm Prices & Market Report

Following are excerpts from the weekly market report of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, prepared by Mr. S. C. Wright:

Potatoes
Tignish: Tablestock Mountains 43c per 75 lbs. No seed moving today. Price about 30c per bus.
O'Leary: Tablestock all varieties 43c per 75 lbs. at car. Sebago and Mountain seed 33c per bus. One car Cobblers moved same price.
Wellington: Tablestock Sebago and Mountains 42c per 75 lbs. Sebago seed 55c per cwt. to farmer at barn.
Summerside: Tablestock all varieties 37 1/2c per 75 lbs. Seed all varieties 35c-40c delivered at Summerside. Few boats loading.
Borden Line: Price up a little. Tablestock Mountains 45c per 75 lbs. No seed moving. Some turnips moving at 40c per bus. to farmer.
Montague: Tablestock all varieties 35c per 75 lbs. at farm or 40c delivered Montague. Turnips 35c per bus. at farm. Movement slow.
Colville and Wiltshire: Cobbler seed 33c-35c per bus. Tablestock 40c per 75 lbs.
Charlottetown: Sebago and Cobbler seed being assembled for boat shipment at 40c per bus. delivered. Light table movement 40c per bag. Turnips 30c per bag delivered.
Vernon River: Light movement of seed. Tablestock 40c per bag.
Cardigan: Tablestock all varieties 40c per 75 lbs. at farm. No seed moving. Few turnips moving at 28c per bus. at farm.
Morell: No movement tablestock or turnips this week. Two cars Katandin seed loaded this week 33c per bus. to farmer.
Souris: No price on tablestock or seed. Boat loaded 30,000 bags 100's of seed and tablestock. Will finish at Summerside.
Elmira: No movement and no price.
Murray Harbour: No movement of seed, tablestock or turnips this week.
Kensington: Tablestock Mountains and Sebago 40c-45c per 75 lbs. Sebago seed 35c per bus. Movement slow.
Market review indicates 40c per 75 lb. bag as right price for tablestock, while seed is worth from 32c-40c per bus depending on the variety. A summary of the situation would indicate that during the past week there were 172 cars potatoes and 22 cars turnips left the Island. At the same time there was considerable stock trucked or railed to Island ports. From all reports it is indicated that potatoes are now pretty well in safe storage. The market at Toronto and Montreal for tablestock rose 7c per 75 lbs. during

the week but indications are that domestic market will not stand a heavy flow of potatoes. Growers should hold firm at 45c per bag according to our local Marketing Board.

Feeds
According to information received Thursday morning the feed market has eased off slightly during the past week. No. 5 wheat is quoted at \$2.83; barley at \$3.14; and feed oats at \$3.00. All these prices are bulk delivered in carlots. It is also reported that dealers are not able to purchase oileake at the present time, and soy bean meal is so high that it is almost impossible to feed. This latter commodity is quoted somewhere about \$4.90 in carlots.

Livestock
Prices on all classes of livestock at Moncton and Charlottetown have remained reasonably steady with a

Butter Prices

During the past week the price of butter advanced one cent on the New Brunswick and Charlottetown markets. About the 6th of November an advance of one cent was made on the Halifax market, but due to an agreement by the New Brunswick manufacturers the price in that province did not advance in sympathy with Halifax at that time. In order to keep the three Provinces in line as far as price is concerned, therefore, it became necessary to advance the price one cent on the Charlottetown market this past week.

Quotations from Halifax under date of November 17th give the factory price F. O. B. Halifax 58c with local jobbing 60c. Montreal butter under date of November 20th is quoted at 57 1/2c for No. 1 solids. In New Brunswick the demand for creamery butter is at present very strong and an increase of one cent per pound has been made on all markets. Quotations are: Creameries to wholesalers, one and two pound flats - 58 1/2c; wholesale to retail stores - one and two pound flats - 60c. Since the last Market broadcast an advance of one cent per pound has taken place on the Charlottetown market, and the quotations are: Wholesale price - one and two pound flats - 57 1/2c F. O. B. Charlottetown, with Local Jobbing at 59c.

The production of butter in this Province is continuing somewhat lower than this time last year. For the week ending November 11th the total number of pounds produced was 80,223 compared with 94,793 for the same week last year, a decrease of 14,570 pounds, or 13.3%.
Under date of November 22nd the Dominion Government announced that it would sell to the trade at a basic price of 57c per pound the butter which it had purchased

earlier this year through its Price Support Programme and which it is now holding in storage. The price will be 57c per pound for first grade creamery butter delivered in carload lots in Ontario, Quebec, and the Maritimes; in British Columbia 56c per pound, and according to

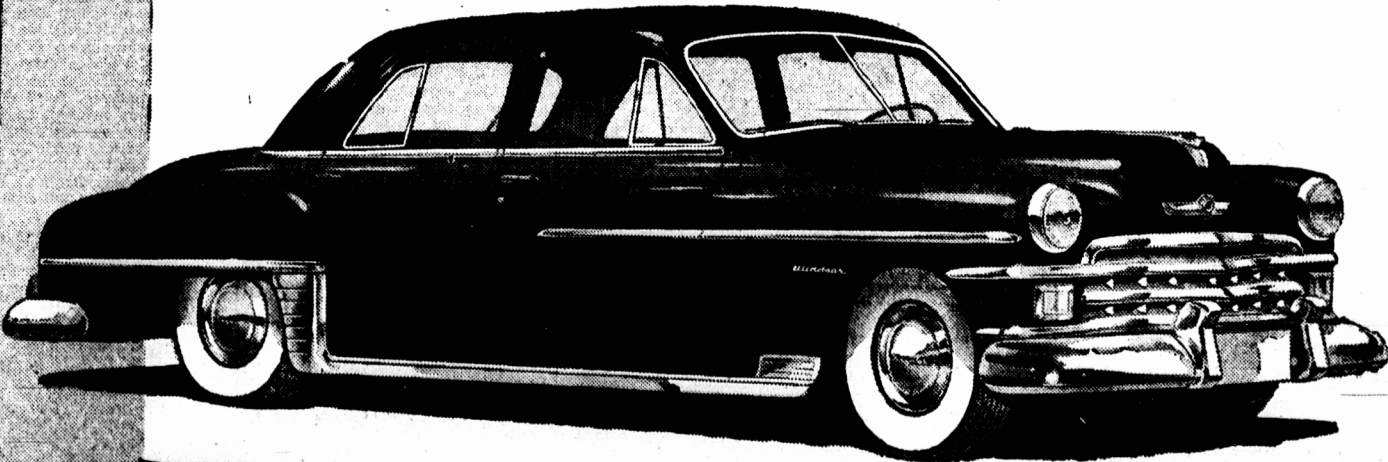
