

# Aaron, Matthews, Logan Belt Braves To 8-1 Win

First-place Milwaukee Braves served out an 8-1 National League victory over Chicago Cubs Monday behind the pitching of starter Bob Buhl and two relievers and the power-hitting of

Johany Logan, Eddie Mathews and Hank Aaron.  
Buhl gave up five hits in getting his first triumph in a seven-inning stint before yielding to a pinch batter. Don McMahon and Bob Giggie finished, issuing only

one more hit.  
Aaron, the league's top batter, added to the Braves' bag of 12 hits off loser Moe Drabowsky and three other pitchers with a triple and a single in four trips to the plate to boost his average to .486.

It was his 17th straight game of hitting safely.  
Aaron's triple and successive walks by Drabowsky to West Covington, Frank Torre and Del Crandall forced in the Braves' first run in the opening inning.

Logan clubbed his second homer of the season in the fourth inning and Mathews increased his league-topping total to 12 with a towering into-the-street homer in the fifth.

Taylor Phillips, John Buzhardt and Bill Henry marched to the mound in the eighth as 10 Braves took their turns. Five runs scored on five hits, a walk, a sacrifice and an error. Mickey Vernon's pinch single was good for two runs.

The Cubs' only run came in the seventh on Bobby Thomson's double and Dale Long's pinch single.

In other National League action, Philadelphia was scheduled at Los Angeles and Pittsburgh at San Francisco in night games.

# Nellie Fox May Finally Win Elusive AL Batting Crown

NEW YORK (AP) — This may be the year Nellie Fox of Chicago White Sox finally captures the elusive American League batting title.

Fox, a consistent hitter during most of his 13-year major league career, has hit safely in his last 16 games and raised his average to .365. He trails only Harvey Kuenn of Detroit, who leads with .405.

Although he has been among the top five hitters in three of the last five seasons, Fox has never

been a real threat for the crown. He had a .317 mark in 1957, the season Ted Williams won with .388. In 1954, Nellie was .319 and Bobby Avila of Cleveland took honors with .341. The White Sox star hit .313 in 1951 when Ferris Fain of Philadelphia led with .344.

In the National League, Hank Aaron of Milwaukee — through Sunday's games — led with .485 average and was on a 16-game batting streak. He had been held hitless in only one of the 24 games he played — by Robin Rob-

erts of Philadelphia on April 22. Smokey Burgess of Pittsburgh is runner-up with .382. Johnny Temple of Cincinnati gained 10 points last week with eight hits in 20 attempts to move into third place with .359.

# Durrelle Oozes Confidence In Speaking Of Title Bout

CARIBOU, Me. (CP) — Yvon Durrelle allowed Monday he's no stand at boxing but contended none the less that when he meets Archie Moore again in July, Arch might as well stay on his stool.

The Baie Ste. Anne, N.B., fisherman divested himself of this and other opinions of his ring prowess Monday at an hour-long

press conference. Durrelle is here to fight Tinker Picot of Dorchester, Mass., tonight.

The scrap is to keep the Canadian and British Empire light heavyweight champ busy before the title rematch with Moore, who absorbed some strong punishment before flattening Durrelle in 11 rounds at Montreal last December.

"If there is anything worse than fighting, it's training," yelled Yvon as he stormed about his hotel room. "But he (his manager, Chris Shaban) keeps getting me into these places. Where am I now? In New York and London (England) they meet me with bands. I come to Maine and they hold me up at the border until they call Washington."

The Durrelle party was a couple of hours late arriving at Caribou. Shaban explained that Nick Kovacs, a Hungarian fighter from the Shaban camp in Moncton, N.B., had been the cause of an immigration incident in Houlton, Me. Kovacs does not hold Canadian or American citizenship.

Promoter Ben Shapiro added that telephone calls to immigration people in Portland and Washington had finally cleared the party at Houlton.  
Durrelle didn't evade any questions.

Tony Anthony? "I beat him in

Detroit (the official version was a draw) and in New York an Anthony TKO victory I couldn't see him. I was blind with food poisoning."

"Patterson? I fought him twice and he doesn't scare me as long as he is walking. When I hit them they go down, I'm afraid they are dead. Then I get scared."

"Moore? When I fight him again he might as well stay on his stool. As soon as he gets up he is going down. He gets all the money. Why shouldn't I get the fight?"

## Baseball Meeting

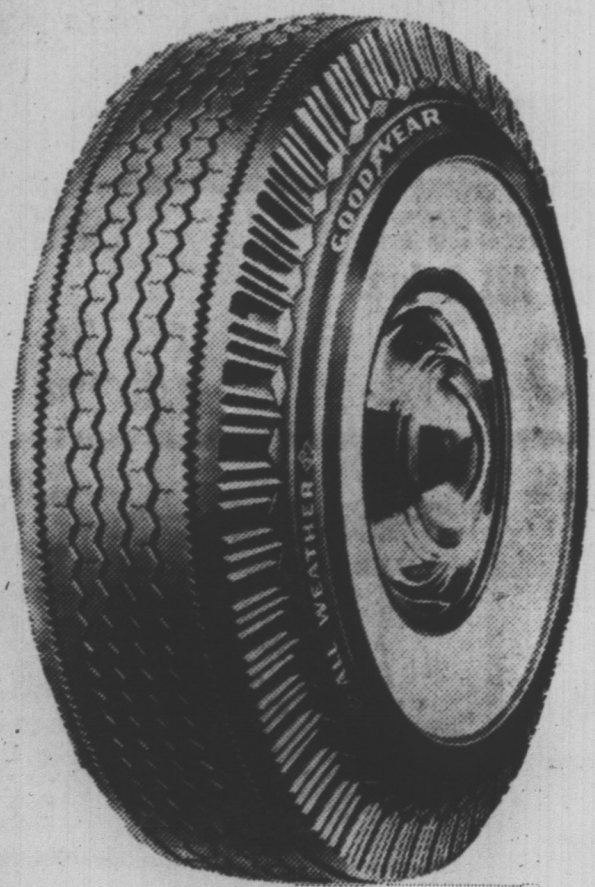

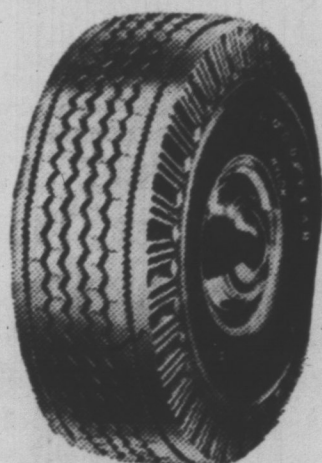
