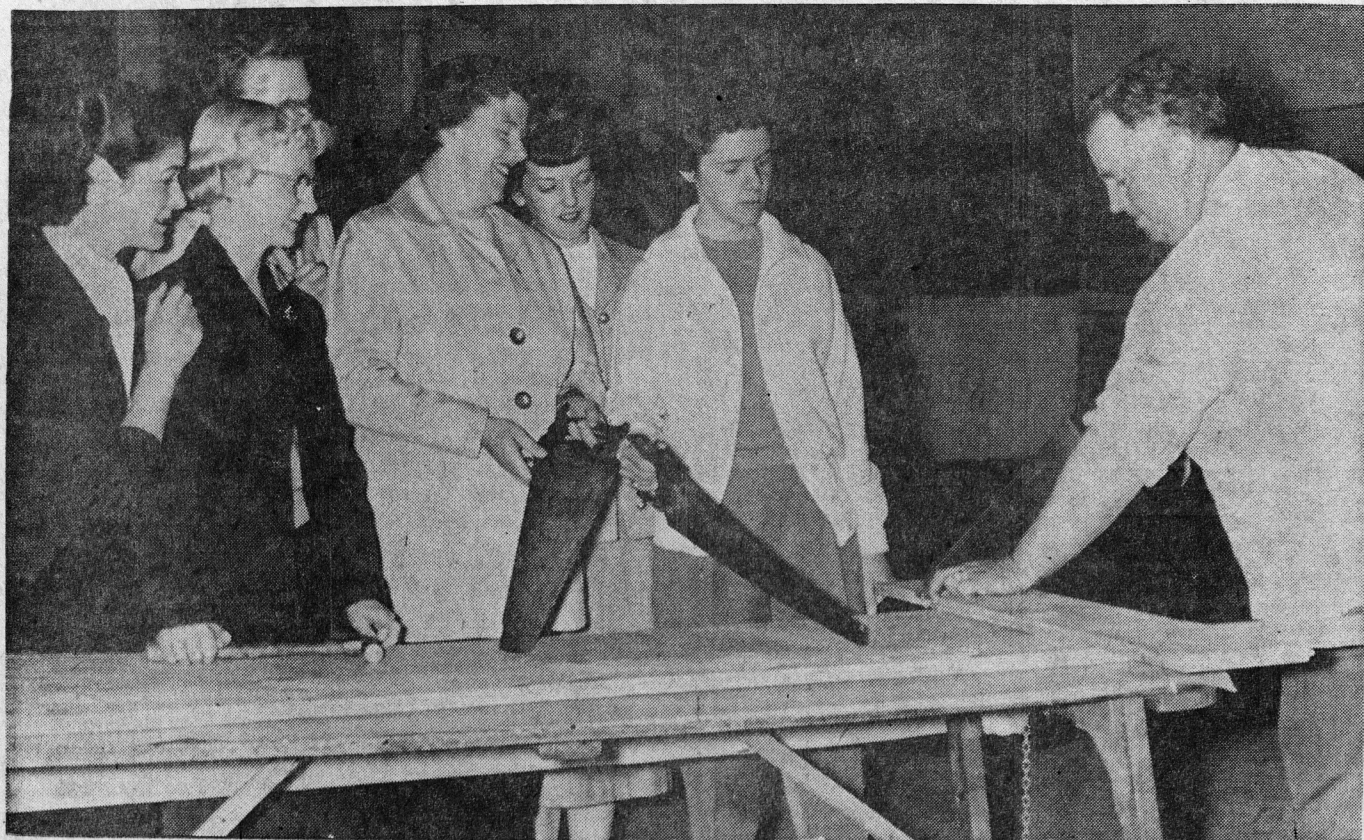


KINSMEN, KINETTES PRESS CARNIVAL PREPARATIONS
