Anderson, Sigsworth Address Final Rally

"To date we have received no reply from either of the two sitting members in Second Kings as to whether or not they feel equal to meeting us in the much-requested joint meeting," Don Anderson and Frank Sigsworth, Liberal candidates in Second Kings, told the final Second Kings campaign convention in Morell last night.

"The people of Second Kings notify us variously that, especially in the height of such a pronounced Liberal swing across the province, our opponents are actually scared of the questions we might ask them, scared even though they could refuse to answer them completely. As one young housewife put it recently: 'It looks to me like those two other fellows would rather keep quiet and only be thought to be no match for either of you boys, than for them to show up with you at a joint meeting and leave no doubt in anybody's mind at all about them.'"

Exactly why they continue to ignore the people's wishes, Don Anderson said, "I really cannot say. One fact seems certain. If they are afraid of a joint

meeting, and people seem to think they are, what, exactly, are they afraid of? Is it the questions or the answers or both that frightens them?" asserted the 38-year-old St. Peter's farmer.

THEIR POSITION

"It appears that the wishes of the people in Second Kings matter comparatively little to either of them," said Mr. Sigsworth. "If they have some faintness of heart about a joint meeting with us, their position as elected representatives of the people should move them out of duty to welcome this opportunity to account for their stewardship. Among other things I should like to ask about is why so many people in Second Kings are continually asserting that our two members don't own us neither do they have any control over what we do. There are other things like Swiss banking procedures, the use of government facilities in campaigning which I guess have to continue to remain a puzzle," stated the 37-year-old lawyer.

Premier Shaw Announces Plant

Premier Walter R. Shaw speaking at a meeting in O'Leary last evening announced that negotiations were underway concerning the establishment of a fish processing plant in Alberton.

The Premier added that there was every indication that the negotiations could be completed successfully and that the firm with whom the government was negotiating had enough faith in the project to make a substantial deposit on it.

The plant is to be established this summer and will be built on the existing wharf in Alberton. The Premier added that it would be necessary to reclaim some land adjacent to the wharf to provide working area for the operation.

When completed the plant will be able to handle 250 tons of herring a day for processing into herring meal oil and approximately 40 tons of ground fish per day for packing. The plant will also be equipped to handle a large quantity of mackerel.

To supply the plant, Mr. Shaw said, a large fleet of wood and steel ships would be required.
