Local and Other Items.

JUVENILE THIEVES.—A gang of juvenile thieves have been apprehended in Moncton and a large amount of stolen goods recovered. None of the boys are over 15 years old.

AUGUST THE 11TH.—Don't forget that the greatest night's sport ever held in the city will be celebrated by electric light on the new grounds of the Athletic Association. All the fastest men in the provinces will take part.

PRIZE MONEY.—It has been decided that the prize money for the battle of Manila will be paid the U. S. sailors at a rate of \$100 for every Spaniard attached to Montejó's squadron. It is understood that he had 2,000 men. Therefore Admiral Dewey will get \$10,000, and his officers and men \$190,000 among them.

A SEVERE STORM.—A severe electrical storm swept over the New England States one day last week. A great deal of damage was done by lightning and in some places the rain fell in torrents. At Arlington, Mass., John H. Orr was killed by lightning, and at Nashua, N. H., Frank W. Hall was struck by a bolt and instantly killed.

BANKING AT DAWSON.—In the course of an interview with the Victoria Colonist, Mr. Macaulay, just returned from the Klondike region at \$12,000,000, of which he says \$10,000,000 has already gone down the river, \$3,000,000 on the Weare and \$2,000,000 on the Bella. A large amount is being deposited at the Bank of British North America and Bank of Commerce, who are paying \$14 cash an ounce for it and giving the balance of its value after the assay is made. Messrs. Doig and Finlayson, formerly of the Victoria branch, are in charge of the Bank of British North America. They are doing business in a tent, with cinders, and take their gold to police headquarters at night. A building is, however, being erected for them.

GOLD FROM KLONDIKE.—A million dollars in yellow dust and drafts. Such is the steamer Cottage City's contribution to the wealth of the world from the 1898 clean-up of the Klondike gold district. The million is divided among some thirty claim owners, while twenty others with their fortunes are now at the gateway cities and will be down by the Tartar and City of Seattle. The new arrivals confirm the average estimates of this year's output in the North, placing the total at from seventeen to twenty-five million dollars; while their presence here is testimony in itself of the success of the upper river steamers of the Klondike and Lake Bennett and the Upper Yukon navigation companies. The Butler Brothers, who have properties on almost every creek in the district, state that from \$300,000 to \$400,000 has already been collected in royalties by the Canadian government this season, this being the best evidence obtainable that the output will be an immense one.—Colonist, Victoria B. C.
