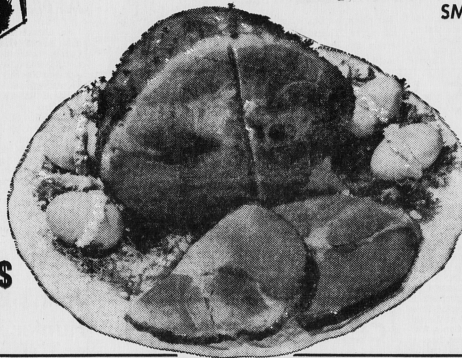
ANCIENT JAWBONE
