

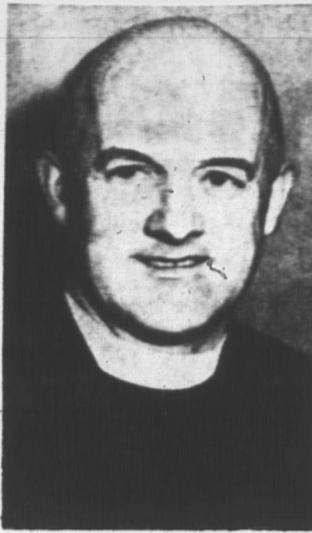
Anglican Bishop Visits This Week

Right Rev. W. W. Davis, DD, DCI, will visit the Island this week, as Anglican Bishop of the Diocese which includes the two civil provinces of Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia.

Bishop Davis' first official act will be the institution and induction of Rev. Michael Ness as rector of the parishes of Crapaud and Springfield. On Thursday and Friday and bishop will officiate at church services and conferences connected with the annual meetings of the Diocesan Church Society and the Diocesan Board of the Woman's Auxiliary.

He will be preacher on Thursday at the DCS - WA service of Evensong in St. Peter's Cathedral, and on Friday at 9 a.m. will celebrate Holy Communion at a second joint service in St. Paul's Church.

On Friday at 2:30 p.m. his Lordship will attend a chapter meeting of the clergy of the deanery at the rectory of St. Peter's Cathedral, when other honored guests will be his Right Rev. Malcolm McEachern, bis-

hop of Charlottetown, with several of the clergy of his diocese.

This meeting will be a sequel to a recent Anglican Chapter Meeting at Summerside when a discussion with a distinguished group of United Church ministers took place.

An important part of Bishop Davis' April itinerary is the conducting of confirmations, four of which will take place during his visitation. Candidates prepared by the rectors of the parishes concerned will receive the Laying of the Hands on Friday 7:30 p.m. at St. Mary's Church Summerside, Saturday 7:30 p.m. at St. Mark's, Kensington, and Sunday at St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. respectively.

The bishop will also visit Holy Trinity Church, Georgetown, and preach there at a 3 o'clock service on Sunday afternoon. His Lordship will return to Nova Scotia on Monday, May 3.

Need For Cold Storage Plant Said Now Under Study Here

It is the government's intention to close the cold storage plant on Esler Street this spring and the resource development division of the department of agriculture is making a survey of the need for cold storage facilities in the province.

Mr. Walter R. Shaw said Monday morning.

Commenting on the intended closure, the premier said "the present building is in such a state of deterioration that it is no longer suitable. It was felt that it might as well be closed down and other available facilities could take care of the demand."

He said, however, that there is a seasonal problem with berry storage and the resources division is making a study to see what this need is. "With increased berry growing," he said, "it may be necessary to establish more cold storage facilities at some point or points in the province."

Premier Shaw pointed out that there have been suggestions that private interests may furnish cold storage facilities. He said "I think this would be a good development."

Membership Expected To Pass Quota

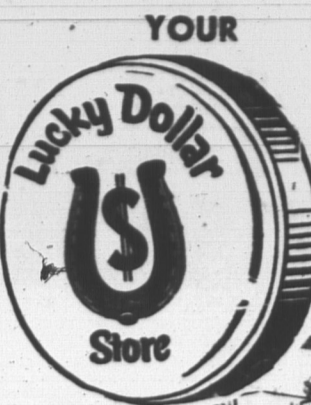

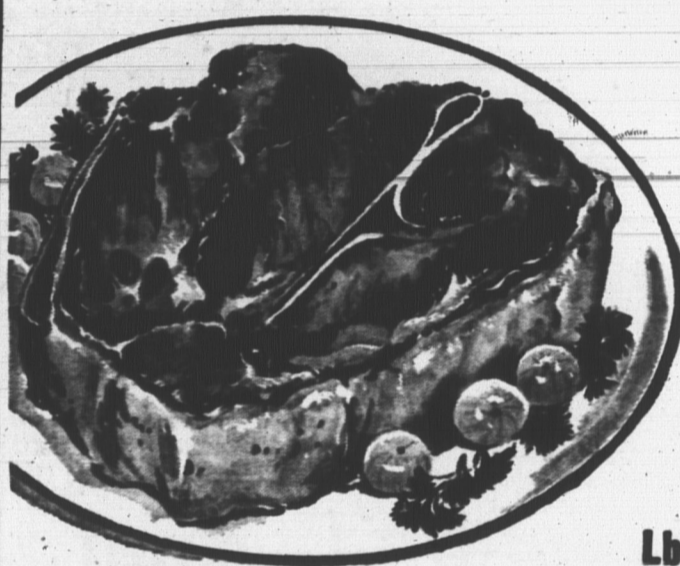

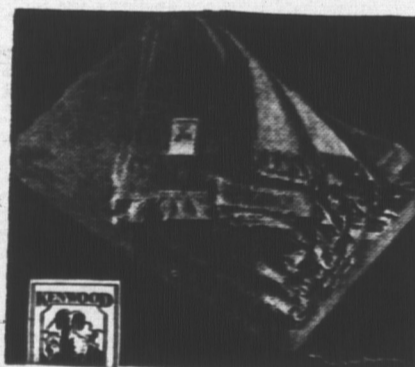
