Avery Brundage Warns France

MADRID (AP)—Avery Brundage, president of the International Olympic Committee, warned Monday that the 1968 Winter Olympics may be taken away from Grenoble, France, if an East German team is not allowed entry into the country.

Brundage made his comment at the end of a meeting of representatives of the International Olympic Committee and National Olympic Associations.

The Olympic congress opens Wednesday with the East-and-West-German issue the thorny problem.

Germany has sent united teams to the last three Olympics, but East Germany wants to enter its own team in the 1968 Olympics at Grenoble in the winter and at Mexico City in the summer.

University Aid Report Scheduled Tomorrow

OTTAWA (CP)—A proposed blueprint for the financing of university education in Canada during the next decade is to be made public Wednesday.

It is the product of a four-man commission of inquiry headed by Dean Vincent Bladen, 65, of the University of Toronto, which was set up by the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada in March, 1964.

The commission received briefs from the academic community, interviewed federal and provincial government officials and conducted the first national study of the financial problems of universities.

Its recommendations are expected to follow up a brief submitted to Prime Minister Pearson by the universities in May, 1963.

That brief asked for federal capital grants of \$300,000,000 over the ensuing three years, but no action was taken. Mr. Pearson said repeatedly university aid would be reviewed once the Bladen report was published.

STARTED IN 1961 Federal grants to universities for operating costs were inaugurated in 1961 on the recommendation of the Massey royal commission on the arts, humanities and sciences. The grants amounted to 50 cents per capita at first, but this was boosted to \$1 in 1967, to \$1.50 in 1968 and to the present \$2 in 1962.

Pope Paul, speaking in French, called on the world to provide more food for the hungry rather than introduce birth control to keep the world from over-population. He said:

"You must strive to multiply bread so that it suffices for the tables of mankind, and not rather favor an artificial control of birth, which would be irrational, in order to diminish the number of guests at the banquet of life."

In the audience was Jacqueline Kennedy who heard the Pope refer to her assassinated husband.

QUOTES KENNEDY "Listen to the lucid words of the great departed John Kennedy, who proclaimed, four years ago: 'Mankind must put an end to war, or war will put an end to mankind.'"

To the delegates who have been striving unsuccessfully for 20 years to achieve world disarmament he said:

"If you wish to be brothers, let the arms fall from your hands. One cannot love while holding offensive arms."

He said: "that as long as man remains 'that weak, changeable and even wicked being that he often shows himself to be, defensive arms will, unfortunately, be necessary.' But he added:

"You, however, in your courage and valor, are studying the ways of guaranteeing the security of international life without recourse to arms. This is an aim worthy of your efforts, this is what the peoples expect of you, this must be achieved."

In speaking of the absence of nations from the world organization, he said:

"Strive to bring back among you any who have left you, and seek a means of bringing into your pact of brotherhood, in honor and loyalty, those who do not yet share in it.

"Act so that those still outside will desire and merit the confidence of all; and then be generous in granting such confidence."

SEEN AS LAST HOPE The Pontiff declared that the peoples of the world turn to the United Nations "as the last hope of concord and peace, and that it offers to the world an extremely simple and fruitful formula of coexistence."

He urged the United Nations to adhere to a formula of equality, "never one above the other."

The Pontiff said he rejoiced that many in the United Nations favored his plea made at the eucharistic conference in Bombay last December that a part of the savings from reducing armaments be used for the benefit of the developing nations of the world.

The developing nations make up the majority of the UN membership, and he praised the work of the United Nations in striving for their economic and social progress.

"We know how intensive and even more effective are the efforts of the United Nations and its related world agencies to assist governments which need help to hasten their economic and social progress," he said.

"We know how ardently you labor to overcome illiteracy and to spread culture throughout the world; to give men adequate and modern medical assistance, to employ in man's service the marvelous resources of science, technology and organization—all this is magnificent and merits everyone's praise and support, including our own."
