Liberal Warhorse Returns To Hustings In 4th Queens

An old Liberal warhorse returned to the political wars when Douglass MacKinnon, long-time member of the Legislature who retired in 1956, appeared on the platform Wednesday night at Verdon River in support of Allison Gillis and Ira Lewis.

Mr. MacKinnon took to the hustings in 4th Queens where he had successfully fought two major campaigns in past years. He received a tremendous reception from the crowd which recalled his oratorical might of other years. Speaking briefly he said he believed in the principles of Liberalism because "it is the party which gave us our freedoms over the years".

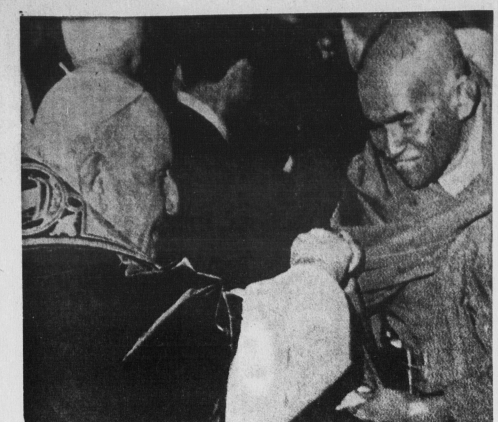
The 76-year-old former cabinet minister said the country "is in a most deplorable condition" and asked his listeners if they were going to return

to power the "man who put it in that state, or will you elect a man who knows how to remedy the situation?"

Mr. Lewis called for retention of control of the CBC—"instead of losing it to the soap and automobile companies"—and said this should be done if necessary by even greater subsidization. He also said more attention would be given to improving rural housing as was now being done with urban areas.

Also speaking briefly were Harold Smith, M.L.A., Dr. Douglas MacDonald and Elmer Blanchard. Chairman was Richard Jenkins, president of 4th District Queens Liberal Association.

328,000 Trout, Salmon Released in Kings Co.

More than 328,000 speckled trout, rainbow trout and Atlantic salmon were released in approximately 60 streams in Kings County in 1967, and it is expected a similar number will be released in these streams this year. This information was given at a meeting of the fisheries officers for Kings, and members of the Cardigan fish culture station.

The meeting was held in the offices of the department of fisheries, Montague. Chairman for the meeting was Thaddeus Sheppard, assistant to the superintendent, Stanley Freeman at the hatchery.

Present for the meeting were members of the Southern Kings Fish and Game Association, the Eastern Kings Fish and Game Association, and R.C.M.P. game warden, G.E. O'Connell.

The eastern association was represented by Joseph Kennedy, the south association by J. Cudmore, in the absence of Louis Cantelo who was ill. Mr. Cantelo is president of the southern Kings association. Officers present from the department of fisheries were: E.F. MacDonald, Peter Sinclair, C.V. Richards and J.G. MacInnis.

Following the listing of distribution of fish in the streams, which had been hatched at the fish culture station at Cardigan, a discussion on the sport fishing results of the area for the past year were discussed. Reports of catches in general were considered to be good, and it was pointed out that many more fishermen existed than in the past.

More good news was a necessity, as pollution of streams must be prevented. It was stated.

Charges Laid In Advance Poll Voting
OTTAWA (CP)—Chief Electoral Officer Nelson Castonguay has announced that charges have been laid under the Canada Election Act against three members of Ottawa Le Droit's staff for publication April 1 of "the result or purported result" of voting in two advance polls for the April 8 Federal election.
The announcement said that an information has been sworn, laying the charges against Gerard Morin, reporter, Aureille Girard, administrator, Camille L'Heureux, editor-in-chief, and the Syndicat d'Ouvriers Sociales Limitee, publisher, of the French-language daily newspaper.
The polls concerned were in Gatineau and Terrebonne where poll officials were dismissed without pay for making a premature count of polling Saturday.
Mr. Castonguay said that the article on which the charge was based appeared in Le Droit Monday under the heading "Advance Liberie."
"The Canada Elections Act makes it an offence for anyone to publish the result or purported result of the polling in any electoral district in Canada before the close of polls," he said.
The Election Act ban on publication of returns until closing of polls on election day has been in the act since 1938. Mr. Castonguay said that as far as he knows, this is the first time a charge has been laid.
