ARRESTED FOR THEFT.—Three employees of Leaman's foundry, Halifax, are under arrest, charged with stealing thousands of dollars worth of goods. They are said to have been in receipt of good wages.

Flogging for Drunkards.

According to a recent despatch from Edinburgh some drastic proposals for the reclamation of drunkards were advanced at the meeting of the Medical Psychological Association by Dr Wilson, the superintendent of the Maxwell Asylum, Midlothian. He would like, he said, to see a clause inserted in the Habitual Drunkards' Bill, at present before Parliament, providing for the flogging of drunkards under appropriate and necessary supervision. The notion of heredity did nothing to help the drunkard, but everything to injure him, for he felt he was bound to give away to drink. A young man so influenced should, it seemed to him, be flogged to within an inch of his life every time he handled drink.

SCORE OLD GUNS.—A couple of old cannon are the first objects of interest which a traveller sees when he steps off the train at Louisburg. They are on the end of the platform and are awaiting carriages which are being built at Halifax. They are made of wrought iron and were hooped, but the hoops are hardly visible, which is not to be wondered at after two hundred years of existence, one hundred and fifty of which were spent in the bottom of Louisburg harbor.

ZOLA WINS.—The libel case of M. Emil Zola against the Petit Journal, of Paris, has resulted in a fine of 2,000 francs upon M. Judet, the editor, and of 500 francs each upon his two assistants. The three were mulcted in five thousand francs each as damages. On leaving the court room the editors were loudly cheered and a man who cried "Viva Zola" narrowly escaped death at the hands of the angry crowd.

SUFFERED FROM POISON.—One day last week at Kingston, Ont., Mr. Pitman and a lady visitor at a house near Storm's Corners ate canned salmon in the can for supper. After eating it they became very ill, and had to have medical assistance. The doctor said they suffered from poison. After careful treatment they recovered.
