WINNIPEG (CP) — Prices generally displayed a firmer tone at the close Wednesday on the Winnipeg grain exchange as both liquidation and offerings eased.
Export business was reported in oats, barley and flax. The barley business involved a parcel lot from the west coast to the United Kingdom. Japan and the United Kingdom took Canadian flax.

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market declined Wednesday on the heaviest volume in four years. The fall was not pronounced despite the large turnover—4,150,000 shares.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 20 cents at \$130.60, the first fall in five sessions.
New York Central was the stock's most active issue up 1-2 days at 29 1/2 on 165,300 shares. Pennsylvania Railroad came next, up 5-8 at 21 1/4, and it was followed by Allegheny Corp. up 3-4 at 7 7/8. Budd Co. up 1-4 at 16, and Republic Pictures up 1 at 6 5/8.
Stocks declining included U. S. Steel, General Motors, Boeing, Douglas Aircraft, Radio Corporation, Western Union, Southern Railway, Northern Pacific, Royal Dutch and Paramount Pictures.
Commonwealth Edison was up 1-3/8 at 48 3/8, and other gainers were Schenley Industries, DuPont, New Haven Railroad, How Sound, Pacific Western Oil and Lehigh Valley Coal 1-4.
McIntyre led higher Canadian stocks advancing 2 points to 71. Hiram Walker followed, up 2-1/4. Dome Mines gained, up 2-1/4. International Nickel, off 7-8, Canadian Pacific, off 3-8, and Distillers Sagran, down 1-4.
