IN MEMORIAM

MRS. SYDNEY B. BIRCH

—It was with a sense of profound sorrow that the people of Birch Hill and vicinity learned of the death on September 22nd of Mrs. Sydney B. Birch at the age of sixty years.

Mrs. Birch, the former Annie Veale, was born in Devon, England, and came to this Province as a young girl and was a life long resident of this place. Her passing at this comparatively early age is deeply regretted and the sympathy of the whole community goes out to her husband and family in this their time of sorrow and bereavement.

Although a person of a quiet and unassuming manner, she had a strange power over the forces of nature, and at a touch of her hand, plants, trees, and flowers sprang into beauty and her home was adorned with many of these beautiful things.

She had been in failing health for the past few months and in spite of loving tender care and skilled nursing, she passed peacefully away to a still more beautiful home which God, in whom she faithfully trusted, had prepared for her.

She was a staunch member of St. James Anglican Church, and was visited by the Rev. L. A. Digby up to the time of his removal from the parish.

The funeral service on Sept. 24 was very largely attended, marking the esteem in which she was held by her friends in the community generally. The service at the home and church was conducted by the Rev. J. R. MacMahon of Aberton. The hymns sung were: "The Lord's My Shepherd", "Rock of Ages", "Abide With Me", "There is No Night in Heaven".

The Rector spoke eloquent words of sympathy and consolation to the bereaved family after which she was tenderly laid to rest in the family plot in the adjoining cemetery.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. SCOTT JARDINE

—The sudden and unexpected death of Mrs. Scott Jardine on September 10th caused a feeling of deep sorrow in Freetown, and also in the town of Summerside where she was so well and favorably known.

Mrs. Jardine was on nursing duty when she was suddenly stricken with a heart attack. She was rushed to P.C. Hospital where everything possible was done for her, but to no avail, and she passed away a few hours later.

The late Mrs. Jardine, whose maiden name was Jennie Damarell, was born in Charlottetown sixty three years ago. She was the daughter of Frederick Damarell and his wife Amelia Perkins. When she was only a year old her mother died, and she was taken to live with her aunt, Mrs. Henry Lewis of Freetown, with whom she resided until her marriage to Mr. Jardine thirty-nine years ago.

After her husband's death she, with her daughter Mildred, moved to Summerside. She made many friends with people in all walks of life. With her cheerful personality and willingness to help others she was an inspiration to all who knew her.

Her clever hands were never idle, and many people will miss things she did for them. In her home she was the soul of hospitality and her many friends were made to feel most welcome.

A few years ago she joined the Presbyterian Church in Summerside. She was very faithful in attendance, rarely missing a service.

Her pastor being absent at the time of her death, the funeral service was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Campbell, and was largely attended. The hymns sung were the ones chosen for her husband's funeral, and were beautifully rendered by a male chorus. They were "Tis Midnight and on Olive's Brow", "Shall We Meet Beyond The River", and "Abide With Me".

The many beautiful floral tributes were evidence of the love and affection in which she was held. Under a beautiful September sky a long procession of sorrowing mourners followed her remains to North Bedeque Cemetery where she was interred.
