**Mr. G. E. Saville Considers City Well Represented**



Mr. George E. Saville (above), representing Fifth Kings district, said in the Legislature yesterday that there was no hardship imposed on the people of this city by virtue of their representation in the House because there were six members who lived here. It was an easy matter, he thought, to interview Government ministers because they were all residents of the capital.

Mr. Saville reminded the House that in the City of the United States, the citizens had no vote at all. He noted that Premier Jones had made reference to new industrial developments and had stated that establishment of the special power line was partly responsible. This would not hold true in King's County, he said.

Mr. Saville agreed with previous speakers that present day pupils were not good readers or writers and also was of the opinion that there were plenty of good teachers in the second class group. He said that there should be more emphasis placed in teaching on the three "R's".

It was news to many members when the speaker stated that there were many carloads of canned carrots being brought into this Province, and he thought that an industry should be established here to supply the demand.

**Discusses Fisheries**

Regarding the fisheries he expressed the belief that the size of lobsters allowed to be caught should be increased and that the people here owed a debt of gratitude to Mr. T. M. Linkletter for his efforts in having the legal size increased. However, he did believe that the season should be longer than it is at present.

Mr. Saville disagreed with previously expressed opinions in that he thought lobsters moved around a great deal. Some of them, he thought, moved so much that they might be caught in Kings County waters, in the off season, and shipped to Prince County to be canned. He fully supported any plans for establishment of fish processing plants in Souris because if they could not get their fish handled there the fishermen would take their catches to Fort Mulgrave or other centres in Nova Scotia.

**Critical of Roads**

He thought there were many roads here where a person "might as well be riding on the shore over the rocks", but in this class he did not include the new road built last year from Pool's Corner to George town. He thought that was a splendid road. He strongly recommended the extension of the Government program of building paved roads.

Mr. Saville noted that there were many people with cars who had to keep them in the garages all winter because of conditions and he thought that they were entitled to be driving them. "The people want roads unless they get them".

The speaker felt that the Government should station the plows in rural centres which were long distances from railroad stations so that following storms the people could get to the railway if they wished to go somewhere. He was critical of the operation of the plows as he said there were five or six weeks passing without rural roads being opened.

The long-time member from Kings was of the opinion that there should be more of the bulldozer type of plows as he did not think the little ones were good enough to handle the snow.

Hon. C. C. Baker, Minister of Agriculture, moved the adjournment of the debate at the closing hour and the Legislature will meet again at 11 a.m. today.

**Montague Lady Dies In 93rd Year**

There passed away at the King's County Hospital last evening one of Montague's grandest old ladies in the person of Miss Margaret Campbell in her 93rd year. Bed ridden for almost 14 years at the hospital, she bravely and cheerfully accepted her lot, and remained throughout those years a patient whom it was a pleasure to serve. Despite her handicap she received her many visitors with her never failing charm, and each birthday was an occasion on which she was tendered a party by her many friends.

Born in Montague, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Campbell, she was the last surviving member of a family of five brothers and two sisters. She is survived by two nieces, Miss Laura Campbell of Wellesley, U.S.A. and Etta, Mrs. Arthur Libby, of Maine, U.S.A., and one nephew, Samuel Campbell of New Glasgow, N.S.

Funeral arrangements had not been completed late last night.
