Beautiful Reproduction Of Famed Harris Painting

A large size, beautifully coloured reproduction of the famous painting, "The Fathers of Confederation," by Robert Harris, C.M.G., R.C.A., has been completed in the photographic studio of Mr. Cleve Craswell, Charlotteville. The original Harris painting was destroyed in the fire at Parliament Buildings at Ottawa in 1917, and no adequate replica is known to exist.

Several months ago a city official presented Mr. Craswell with a much damaged steel engraving of the painting, in black and white, which he had found among the refuse in a disused cellar. With great patience Mr. Craswell and his wife, the former Clarinda MacDonald, a talented artist in her own right, set to work. First the smudgy reproduction was cleaned, and the torn sections fitted together. Then a small photograph was taken. This was enlarged subsequently to the size chosen for the final product.

It required twelve weeks of constant effort on the part of Mr. and Mrs. Craswell to complete their reproduction. Measuring 36 x 22 inches, the portrait is done in oils—not the usual photographic oils, but the true painters' oil, Mr. Craswell explained. Each figure has been retouched and highlighted so that all stand out clearly and distinctly. It is hardly conceivable that such a bright multi-colored picture was obtained from such a dull gloomy print.

The portrait is so framed as to give a distinct impression of depth. The frame itself is three-fold an inner gilt border, surrounded by a rich band of Circassian walnut, the whole enclosed with a 4-inch scrolled gilt frame.

One has to see this picture to appreciate fully the immense amount of work, thought, and artistry required to produce it. Viewed in proper background and lighting, it becomes an excellent reflection of the original, an outstanding addition to the many fine productions of these accomplished Islanders.

Mr. Craswell has had the distinction of having his portraits hung in a number of European salons. As early as 1924 his portrait of a local physician, which he named "The Doctor," was chosen as one of an outstanding international group displayed in Malta. Other studies were shown in later years at salons in Brussels and Paris. For many years his studio has been turning out a large number of excellent portraits, camera studies and scenic views of rural Prince Edward Island.

The completed reproduction of the Harris picture is shown above. On the left is shown the damaged engraving from which Mr. Craswell worked.

CHARACTER (BUT NOT CASH) TEST OF A MAN'S WORTH
QUESTION: "What is Mr. B. worth?"
ANSWER: "He is worth a hundred thousand dollars."

No more meaningless answer to a meaningless question could ever be given than that. And yet that is the kind of answer ordinarily expected when that question is asked.

"How much did he leave?" was a question once asked when a wealthy man passed from this earth. "Why, he left it all," was the reply. But when a further question was asked about the causes to be served by what he left, there was silence.

"He had valued his community only for the opportunity it afforded for his personal gains, and in his will he saw to it that the community as such got no returns. What was he worth? Absolutely nothing to anyone but certain heirs whom he had made as selfish as himself. What is anyone worth? The real answer is found in what he made of his family, the character he cultivated in them, the principles he taught and the ideals he inspired in his sons and daughters and the leadership he gave in things worth while COMMON GOOD

His value to his church and community is determined by his service to the common good, and the contribution he made to its character, by what he did for the underprivileged, by the way he met his obligations and took his part in its social enterprises.

What did he stand for in politics? What position did he take and what influence did he exert in his church?

It is far less what he gives or does than what he is that decides his worth. It is a saying old but true of many a one we know: "What you are speaks so loudly that I can't hear what you say."

Jesus did His work through persons. NOT THROUGH BOOKS — Jesus never wrote a line. NOT BY ARMED FORCE — He despised the use of physical violence for spiritual ends. He won persons to Himself.
