Thoughts For Our Time

FAMILY LIFE

Marriage is a state of life which is entered into by the vast majority of mankind; yet despite this, the duties and obligations which it imposes are overlooked or neglected by many of those who enter into it. We must realize that marriage is a sacred contract between a man and a woman. It is something more than a mere civil contract governed by civil laws which two free parties make and which can be broken by their mutual consent. It has, in addition, by its very nature, a sacred and religious character because of its institution, Author and purpose being instituted by Almighty God himself from the beginning of time when He created man and woman and bestowed on them the power of co-operating with Him in bringing forth new life and of educating those offspring, to fulfill their purpose here on earth and for all eternity - to know, love and serve their Creator. Even among pagan peoples, the force of the natural law alone there was always some kind of religious ritual connected with the marriage contract, as man realized he was contracting most solemn and sacred obligations toward his spouse, his children and society.

Since God has willed that marriage is to be the means of suitable propagation of the human race in accordance with man's nature and destiny, it follows that this state, in order to fulfill such a purpose, must be vested with a certain permanence and stability. If such stability is lacking, how could the proper education and upbringing of children resulting from such a union be adequately provided for? Therefore, although

A marriage hastily contracted without due consideration of the step one is taking, is almost always an unhappy marriage. Marriage, it is true, is based on love, on the mutual love between man and woman; but that love must also be based on reason, for man is a rational being. That love, moreover, must be a love which is unselfish - not a love which seeks its own happiness only, but one which strives to devote itself to another, to confer happiness on another - in a word, a love which is based ultimately on the love of God. Such is the admonition which the priest reads to the prospective bride and groom at the beginning of the marriage ceremony - "It is most fitting that you rest the security of your wedded life upon the great principle of self-sacrifice. . . . Sacrifice is usually difficult and irksome. Only love can make it easy, and perfect love can make it a joy."

Such a union cannot help but be blessed by Almighty God, and

even though there will always be some trials and difficulties in every marriage, as man cannot escape these in this life, if they are made generously, in a spirit of unselfishness, they will increase, rather than diminish, the love between husband and wife. Since marriage is a Sacrament, we must remember that it also confers the right to certain actual graces or helps from God to live up to the obligations imposed by this state in life; and the contracting parties may not merely hope for but may expect, these Divine aids to carry out their duties as Christian man and wife. It can be confidently stated that the moral health of a nation depends on the state of family life within that nation; and the latter is a direct result of the respect and reverence which people show toward the duties and obligations of Christian marriage. If we disregard God's Laws for our own selfish purposes, how can we expect His blessing on our country? How can we say that ours is the cause of godliness, if we pick and choose in the observance of God's Commandments? Many of our sins and failings are for the most part detrimental to ourselves. When we offend God, then we alone are the chief losers. When we fail in our respect for Christian marriage, then the effect of this always redounds to others' loss or unhappiness - that of our spouse, our children and our country. We never suffer alone. It is somewhat of an anomaly to call ours a Christian society, if we reduce the very basis of the Christian community - marriage - to the level of any bilateral civil contract. From the natural law alone, without the help of Divine Revelation, man has shown a realization that marriage was endowed with some sacredness and solemnity; and yet, with no excusing ignorance, we claim that man alone is the arbiter in the marriage contract. A true respect for Christian marriage means a truly Christian family, a truly Christian country; it makes Christianity "the following of Christ", a living vital principle of life, and not merely a veneer of righteousness which strives to clothe selfishness in the garb of godliness.
