Will Of Warren Wright Filed For Probate

MIAMI, Fla., Jan. 9. (AP) — Mrs. Warren Wright, widow of the wealthy owner of Calumet Farm, today was named sole executor of the estate of her husband who died Dec. 28. His will filed for probate left the famous stud farm at Lexington, Ky., and its stable of some of America's finest race horses to his wife, Lucille. With it went a great personal fortune. In the event of Mrs. Wright's death, the will provides that the entire estate go to their only child, Warren Wright, Jr. Named second executor to take over in the event of Mrs. Wright's death was Daniel J. Mahoney, a close friend of the Wrights for many years and publisher of the Miami Daily News. Wright, Jr., was designated a trustee and was given an immediate bequest of \$500,000 and a trust fund in the same amount. Other bequests totalled \$126,000. Ben Jones, veteran trainer of such Calumet horses as Whirlaway and Ponder, and his son, Jimmy Jones, present trainer, each receives \$100,000. There was no estimate of the total value of the estate.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL COOKING. Should sufficient applications be received, courses in elementary and advanced cooking will be organized to begin on the evening of January 22, 1951. Send applications to the Director of the School. Since classes are limited to 16, applicants are advised to send applications at once which will be filed on a first-come-first-served basis.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL HOME MANAGEMENT. A six week's course in Home Management for the girls of the Province will begin on January 29, 1951. This course will include such topics as cooking, sewing, practical home nursing, crocheting, knitting and etiquette. Financial assistance will be given to those between the ages of 16 and 30 satisfactorily completing the course. Up to \$6.00 per week will be allowed. Applications must be filed before January 24. Mail all applications to the Director of the Vocational School.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL FARM MECHANICS (Night Course). If sufficient applications are received, a night class in Farm Mechanics will be organized. This course will include, among other things, tractor tune-up and minor repairs, as well as care and maintenance of farm machinery. This course will begin on January 15, 1951. Mail all applications to the Director of the Vocational School as soon as possible. Classes will be limited in number to ten students.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL WELDING. If sufficient applications are received, a course in acetylene welding lasting approximately six weeks will be given. The course is limited to 9 students. Applications will be received on a first-come-first-served basis. Mail applications to the Director of the Vocational School. Should the course be given, applicants will be notified of the date on which it will begin.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL BLACKSMITHING (Night Course). There are still some vacancies in this course which is designed to give the man or boy already on the farm a knowledge of the technique of blacksmithing as well as a skill in making certain simple repairs to farm machinery. Instruction on horseshoeing will also be given. Classes in this course will resume on January 10, 1951. Those interested should send applications immediately to the director of the Vocational School.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL BLACKSMITHING (Day Course). If sufficient applications are received, a course in blacksmithing lasting from four to eight weeks will be given. This course will be primarily for men from the various farming communities who wish a knowledge of the principles of blacksmithing for use on their farms. Financial assistance will be given to those between the ages of 16 and 30 satisfactorily completing the course. Up to \$6.00 per week will be allowed. This course will begin on January 15, 1951. The course is limited to ten students. Applications will be received on a first-come-first-served basis. Mail applications to the Director of the Vocational School.
