Of Special Interest to our Farmers

NORTH WEST CROPS

Dr. Saunders Report—Prices in Manitoba.

A telegram has been received from Dr. Saunders, who is at Indian Head, stating that there is an immense crop in the North West. There was a slight frost, but he does not think it has done much harm. The weather has been unsettled during the past few days, and work delayed in some localities. Wheat is beginning to move towards the lake front from Southern Manitoba points, and shipments will increase daily from this out.

No. 1 hard is quoted at 57 cents where 16 and 16 cent freight rate prevails, and 56 cents on 17 and 18 cent rate. Cash wheat, Fort William, 70 to 70 1-4c; October delivery, 68 1-2 cents.

Edmonton papers state the Alberta crops will be saved without injury in spite of the cool weather and excessive rains. Last month the rainfall at Calgary was over nine inches, and heavier in some other parts.

THE FARMER MUST PAY.

Tremendous Advance in the Lake Freight Rate.

A big advance in the lake transportation rates on grain has taken place owing, it is said, to the enormous shipments of iron ore from Duluth to Buffalo and the chartering of all the available vessels at enormously increased rates. The ore shipments have been bidding against the wheat shipments for vessel room at Duluth during the past week, and the result is that there was an advance of one cent a bushel on wheat, of thirty to thirty-five cents on iron and fifty cents a thousand on lumber in lake transportation rates. The latest quotations on wheat from Duluth to Buffalo are five cents a bushel, and Winnipeg grain dealers are unable to make contracts from Fort William at less than six cents a bushel to Buffalo, as against about two and a half cents last year, and an anticipated maximum this year of three cents. The supply of vessels at Fort William will, it is expected, be very short, and those now available and in the trade will simply be gold mines during the next few months.

The disheartening effect of this so far as Manitoba and the west are concerned is to throw an additional burden on the grain and lessen the amount that the farmer will receive. It is usual for rates to take an upward jump towards the close of navigation, but this year owing to the extraordinary movements of iron ore as well as

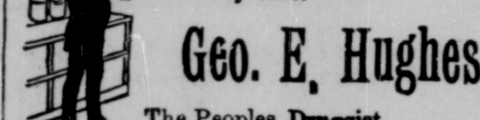

Tighten the Nuts.

I have on my farm an old rear cut mowing machine, which has been in use for 21 years. I never get off the machine to oil it without examining every nut, and if any of them are loose I tighten them. I mow over some very rough ground, but in spite of this, and because of good care, the machine is in working condition today. The same principle holds good for every farm implement. Lots of nuts on a wagon often cause serious accidents. Frequent examination and proper tightening pay better than any work the farmer can do. The machine on which every nut is tight works much easier, and is much more efficient.

British Columbia Crops.

Mr. W. Finlayson, who is a large property owner in the Okanagan Valley, British Columbia, reports that the heavy rains have almost completely ruined the grain there. One farmer, who represented the ranch owned by Sir Arthur Stepney, had told him the day before he felt that where he had expected 500 tons of grain he now expected one. The fruit crop, too, was practically a total loss, and it would be bad for British Columbia farmers this year. He understood the wet season had covered a large area and would affect the Western States as well.

Speaking of mining, Mr. Finlayson said the country was all right in that respect, and plenty of farmers within short distances of Revelstoke, Armstrong, and the junction entrance near Crow's Nest Pass, would find in a few years some valuable mineral deposits.
