**YORK, England (AP)**—Lord Halifax, former foreign secretary who served Winston Churchill as British wartime ambassador to Washington, died Wednesday night. He was 78.

The angular, deeply religious Lord Halifax had survived an earlier association with the pre-war appeasement government of Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain to join in Churchill's blood-sweat-and-tears campaign to triumph.

He also had served as viceroy to India. His days as an active policymaker ended in 1946.

He had been suffering from a chest complaint and his son and heir, Lord Irwin, told reporters his father "was just completely worn out." He died at his family home, Garrowby Hall, near York. He had been confined to his bed the last two days.

Lord Halifax stumped up a fob-fund Chesapeake Bay aboard the battleship King George V on Jan. 24, 1941, to take up his duties as ambassador to Washington in the trying early days of the war.

The late President Franklin D. Roosevelt disregarded protocol and motored through a pouring rain to greet the new envoy at Annapolis, Md., instead of waiting for him to present his credentials at the White House.

The United States was not yet at war and the British ambassador had to feel his way, urging material aid to Britain from a nation still not unanimous in its opinion on the war question.

On visits to U.S. cities, Halifax was a target of eggs and tomatoes thrown by women peace demonstrators. Picket lines were put up in opposition to his tours. But he took it in stride.

A shy, scholarly man with a withered arm from birth, Lord Halifax still was an able athlete and a love of the fox hunt.

Born Edward Frederick Lindley Wood April 18, 1881, he entered public life in 1910 as a Conservative member of Parliament, a seat he held for 15 years.

As a colonel of the Yorkshire Dragoons, he led his regiment in the First World War.

He served as parliamentary undersecretary for the colonies in 1921-22; president of the board of education 1922-24 and minister of agriculture 1924-25 before replacing the Marquess of Reading as viceroy in India in 1926.

**CRITICAL PERIOD**

As Baron Irwin, he took up the Indian post in the critical days of British-Indian relationships that eventually led to independence. He became intimately associated with Mohandas K. Gandhi and the All-India Congress Party and became known as "The Great Sahib."

He returned to England in 1931 and succeeded his father as Viscount Halifax in 1934. He became foreign secretary in 1933, succeeding Anthony Eden. Eden had resigned in protest against Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain's concessions to Hitler at Munich.

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

The bidding:

South West North East  
1♣ Pass 2♣ Pass  
2♦ Pass 4♦ Pass  
5♣ Pass 6♣

Opening lead—king of spades.

The power of the crossruff is shown in this hand from a recent tournament. North optimistically pushed the bidding to a slam despite the minimum bids South had made during the auction.

West led a spade and dummy took the ace. Declarer cashed the A-K of hearts, discarding his spade loser, and then embarked on a crossruff.

The plan was to trump three clubs in dummy, trump three spades or hearts in his own hand, and thus make twelve tricks.

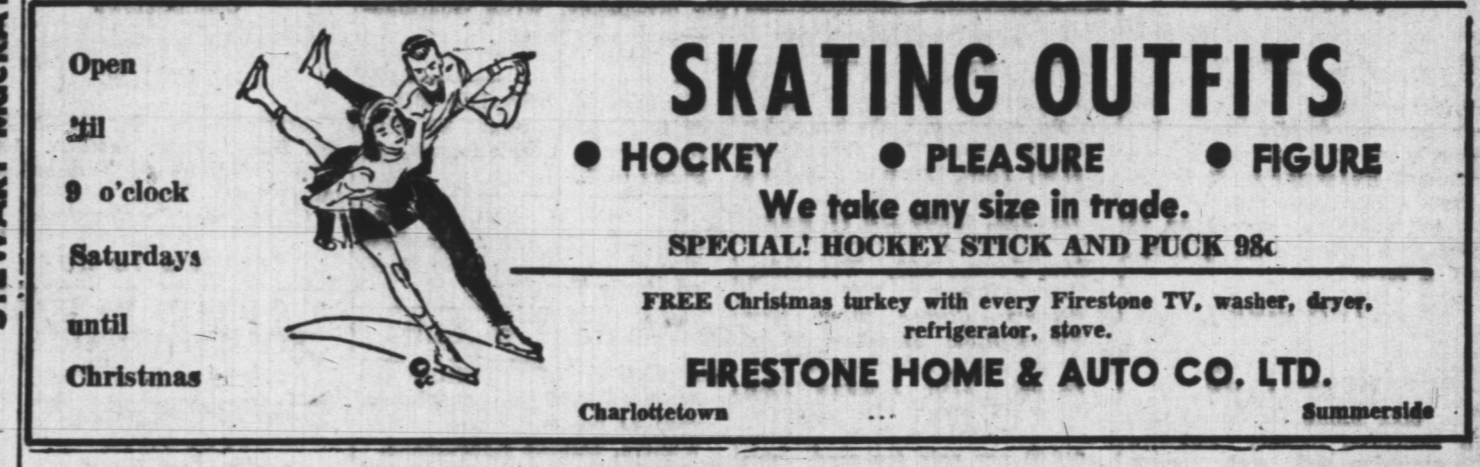
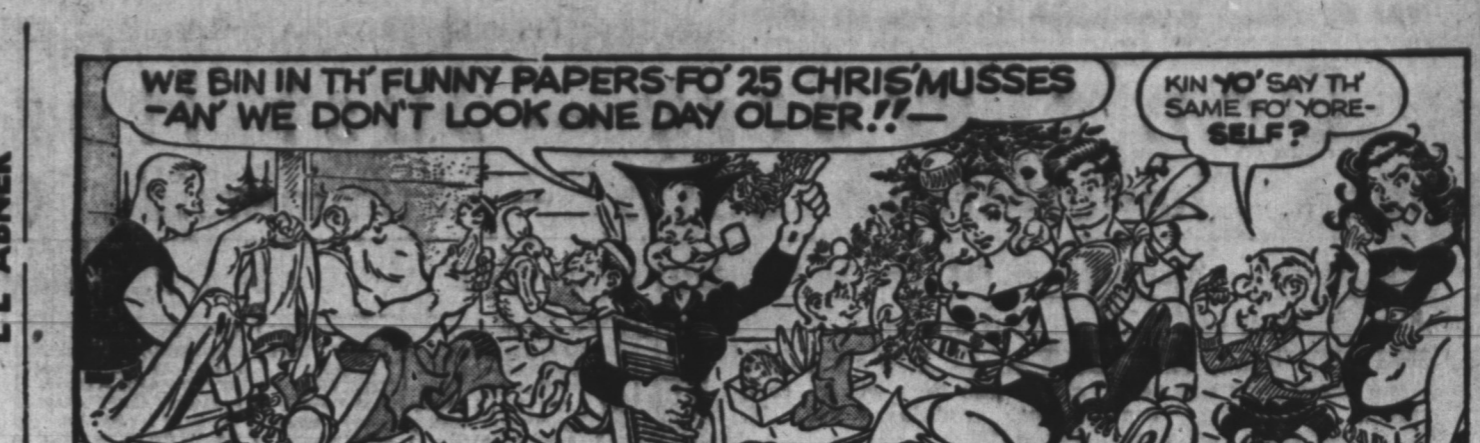
