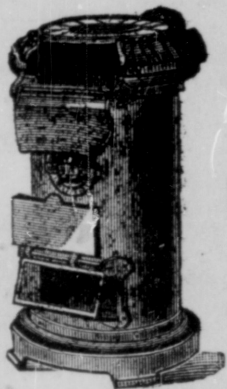

WILL LIKELY BEGIN EARLY NEXT WEEK

Large Boer Force Confronts Methuen

Lord Kitchener to Command in India — General Hunter to Succeed Him as Lord Roberts' Chief of Staff — Boers said to be Active — Kruger's Boast — Joubert's Death and Funeral.

JOUBERT'S SUDDEN DEATH.

PRETORIA, March 30.—General Joubert was taken ill on Sunday morning. He was at his office on the previous day. He suffered great pain, but became unconscious sometime before his death. His complaint was acute inflammation of the bowels.

JOUBERT'S FUNERAL.

PRETORIA, March 30.—Joubert's funeral took place here yesterday. He will be buried to-day at Rustenburg, in his private mausoleum with military honors. The captured British officers sent a floral tribute.

STRENGTHENING POSITIONS.

ALIAWAL North, March 30.—General Brabant and his staff have returned from Rouxville and are now actively engaged in holding the southern frontier of the Free State.

Detachments are being sent to strengthen the positions which have been occupied.

KRUGER'S LITTLE GAME.

LONDON, March 30.—The Bloemfontein correspondent of the Morning Post, telegraphing on Wednesday says: Kruger boasts his intention to take Bloemfontein within a week, and it appears probable that the Boers are advancing in force southward.

BOERS ACTIVE.

LONDON, March 30.—A despatch to the Daily Chronicle from Bloemfontein, dated March 29th, says: "The Boers are active north of Glen, about fifteen miles from here. It is reported that they are concentrating in considerable force.

Reinforcements of all arms are being sent up from Bloemfontein, including the Seventh Division and a portion of General French's cavalry.

KITCHENER FOR INDIA.

LONDON, March 30.—It is reported in a well informed quarter that Lord Kitchener will be offered the post of Commander-in-Chief in India, succeeding the late Sir William Lockhart, so soon as decisive successes have been obtained in the Transvaal, and that General Archibald Hunter will succeed him as Lord Roberts' chief of staff.

Indian newspapers have been urging Lord Kitchener's appointment.

THE BRITISH ADVANCE.

LONDON, March 30.—Beyond some indecisive fighting at Warrenton, where a large Boer force confronts Lord Methuen, there has been no news of importance during the last twenty-four hours from seat of war.

The time that Lord Roberts begins his advance, it is thought in well informed quarters here, will be early next week. Lord Methuen is not likely to make any attempt to drive back the Boers in front of him.

The recall of the British troops from the Barkley West district and Griquatown north west of Kimberley, would seem to indicate that preparations for a general

advance northward by British armies are nearly completed.

One thing which has been delaying Lord Roberts is the lack of warm clothing for the troops.

THE STANLEY. The Stanley arrived from Pieter about noon today. Her cargo included 397 bags grain, 300 barrels flour, 15 puns molasses, 170 pkgs. cordage, 200 boxes in plate, 14 hogsheads tobacco and 757 pkgs. sundries. The steamer will leave for Pieter on Monday morning at 7 o'clock.

A Big Hog — Mr. John Campbell, of Darlington, brought to market to-day a hog weighing 680 pounds.
