MADRID, May 15.—Official assurances have been given to the United States authorities that the commander of the Spanish fish gunboat which fired on the Alliance has not been promoted as has been stated in the American press within the last day or two. The government states that the lieutenant in command of the ship has been disembarked as a means of disapproval of his act. It has been transferred to another ship, where his rank is the same as when he commanded the Conde De Venadito. This has not been and will not be any promotion, and the disembarking and transfer of the officer is regarded as equivalent to a censure.
