New York Stocks
NEW YORK (AP)—A late flurry of selling knocked the stock market out of a narrow rut of irregularity Tuesday, and prices were down all around at the close.
Some firmness was found in oil. The railroad section was boosted as a group by a rise of 6 1/4 at 153 1/4 in Atlantic Coast Line.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was down 70 cents at \$148.70. It was up 20 cents Monday. The industrial component of the average dropped \$1.60 and utilities were off 20 cents while railroads, because of Atlantic Coast Line, were up 10 cents at a new high of \$116.00.
At the top of the most active list was Texas Pacific Land Trust, up 3/4 at 14 on 67,400 shares. T.N.I. Oil Corp. was the second up 2 1/4 at 34 1/2. Electric and Musical Industries, traded in blocks as large as 10,000 shares, was third up 1/2 at 3 1/2.
Among stocks losing ground were Santa Fe, New York Central, Standard Oil (N.J.), American Airlines, American Telephone, Kennecott, Copper, du Pont, Westinghouse Electric, Republic Steel, Youngtown Sheet and Tube, Chrysler, Boeing, and Radio Corp.
Canadian issues closed mixed. Distillers Seagram and Canadian Pacific each added 1/4. International Nickel and Hiram Walker both eased 1/4. Dome Mines and McIntyre both remained unchanged.
Giant Yellowknife was off 1/4 on the American stock exchange and Royalite Oil advanced 1/4. Lake Shore remained unchanged.

88th Annual Meeting Bank of Commerce
