Not Worried By New York Strike

CORNER BROOK, Nfld. (CP) Spokesmen for Newfoundland's two pulp and paper plants report the newspaper deliverymen's strike in New York will not affect their output unless the dispute remains unsettled for a long period.

A spokesman for Bowaters here said his company ships 35,000 tons of newsprint to New York markets annually. Tonnage now not being used by New York will be sent to Miami as an advance order.

President T. R. Moore of the Anglo- Newfoundland Development Company in Grand Falls said his firm produces 30,000 tons annually for New York papers. He did not foresee any immediate loss of markets.
