Canada Consumes Large Part Of Own Heavy Production

Canada is a giant exporter but she consumes a surprisingly large proportion of what she produces.

This was pointed up in a series of statistics presented by John D. Campbell, president of Canadian Westinghouse Co. Ltd. in a recent address to the international business management conference of Westinghouse Institute College.

In so-called extractive industries, for instance, which include forestry, fishing and mining, she consumes 82 per cent of her own production and exports the rest 18 per cent to other countries. This group includes such products as unmanufactured asbestos, crude petroleum fish, copper ore and zinc ore.

In primary manufacturing, including newspaper, lumber, wood pulp, uranium, nickel, aluminum and foodstuffs, she consumes 68 per cent and exports 32 per cent, despite the fact that about 97 per cent of her output, 93 per cent of nickel and 60 per cent of copper are exported.

In agriculture she consumes 71 per cent and exports 29 per cent, with only about 20 per cent of the exports.

EXPORTS LOW
 In secondary manufacturing industries involving a large amount of processing, she consumes 92 per cent and exports eight per cent.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are the dealer, both sides vulnerable. What would you bid with each of the following five hands?

1. One club. This follows the standard procedure of bidding the suit beneath the singleton in hands with a five-card suit in 4-4-1. Experiment will show that following this method permits the partner to show at the lowest possible level.

2. One club. Here, also, economic bidding is served by opening with a club instead of a spade. Generally, the higher ranking of two 11 or 12 card suits is bid first, but where the suits involved are spades and clubs, the club is named first. Later, the spades are repeated to show they are five cards in length.

3. One club. Hands containing high-card points are mandatory opening bids, and the fact that there is no bidable suit by ordinary standards is not a valid excuse for passing. In this case we cannot open with a no-tenor suit, as should seldom be bid. In this case, clubs are named only as a last resort.

4. One diamond. We cannot open with one trump because that would show 16, 17 or 18 points, and this hand has 19. The natural bid of a diamond, the only bidable suit we have, is therefore made.

5. It is true that partner will be ignorant of the strength of the bid in this case is based on 19 points, but we intend to let him know about the excess strength by jumping the bidding at the next opportunity. If partner passes we are diamond, there can be no game.
