Twenty-One Reasons

WHY AND HOW THE WOMAN'S TEMPERANCE UNION SHOULD BE SUSTAINED.

3. It is a Temperance Organization, which simply means educating public sentiment up to total abstinence for the individual and prohibition for the nation.

4. It is a union of all churches, all colors, all ages and all castes.

5. It aims at clearing the track of obstacles that wreck; that humanity may have a better, freer and safer train through life, and fewer hindrances in attaining the eternal goal.

6. It seeks to open eyes, that the people may know that the spirit of evil is in the intoxicating cup, and that misery, poverty and crime follow its indulgence.

7. This Organization has brought to light the hidden things of darkness, that exist and thrive through the continuance of this cruel and diabolical traffic. It has also measurably succeeded in removing from the table of the Lord the cup that inebriates.

8. The W. C. T. U. spreads its sheltering wing over tender childhood, and endeavors to shield the young by instructive and loving fortifications, that may prove imperious to every onset of the liquor enemy.

9. It reaches out a kind and sympathetic hand, to win from the path of error, sin and wrong the unwary who have been caught in the meshes of Rum's net, and point them to Jesus, "The Way, the Truth and the Life."

14. Do not go to the meetings to find fault or to criticize, but to kindly suggest plans of improvement and to take part in all the exercises.

15. Have full confidence in the work, and confidence in the ability God has given you, whether chosen for office or committee, or private member. "You have a work none other can do."

16. The cause is of such vital importance, that every man, woman and child, is needed to fight against this colossal liquor slavery which is inimical to the physical, mental and moral well-being of society.

17. The world's moral destiny is wrapped up in woman, whose sphere is home, but not confined to home. Her place is in the church, in the Union, in the Missionary Auxiliary, everywhere and anywhere, to help fallen humanity (Godward and heavenward).

18. Young ladies do not suppose your place is not in the W. C. T. U. You are specially needed. Your talents fresh, spirits buoyant and thoughts hopeful, ally yourselves with this worthy association, the mingling with the more mature will greatly develop your judgment and render you more efficient for good.

19. Life is short at best to accomplish much for the Master, then we ought to be up and doing, for the night of death is at hand.

20. The cause with which we stand identified is gaining strength and influence in the eyes of the law, which should stimulate to more fervent prayer, increased faith and courageous activity.

21. The W. C. T. U. cheers hearts, brightens homes, lifts burdens, scatters smiles, consequently like Charity, "seeketh not her own, but works for God and home and native land."
