## Howard Court Funeral Today

Howard H. Court, B.A., B.Ed. of Mt. Stewart died Sunday at the Prince Edward Island Hospital after an illness of several months. The late Mr. Court was born in Donaldson 66 years ago. He was educated at the local school and Prince of Wales College and later qualified for the degree of Bachelor of Arts from Mt. Allison University, Sackville and Bachelor of Education from the University of Alberta. Mr. Court spent all of his life in the work of education except for the years in military service. He taught school in this province, was later inspector of schools and then went to Prince of Wales College as director of the teacher training program. He taught in a high school for 14 years at Tabor, Alberta, before retiring in June 1961. Mr. Court went overseas with the Second Siege Battery in the First Great War and went overseas again in World War Two with a Canadian military unit and later commanded an Anti-Aircraft Battery in Halifax and Dartmouth, N.S., and retired with the rank of major. Surviving are his wife, the former Ella Glover of Mt. Stewart, one sister Mrs. Laura Johnston, Cambridge, Massachusetts and a brother Fern Court in Bedford. The funeral service this afternoon will be in the Mount Stewart United Church, Interment will be in the People's cemetery there.
