UPEI- The University of Prince Edward Island Basketball Panthers hosted Smuggler's Jug of the Ch'town Senior Men's League and pulled off a 79-59 victory here on Friday. UPEI's Wonder Squad (every one is wondering how they will do this season), played Smuggler's as a warm-up for the upcoming AUAA season.

Newcomer Dave Arseneault led the Panther attack with 21 points while Dennis High netted 20 points and hauled in 12 rebounds. Other top scorers were Lloyd Pullen and Vince Murray with 14 each, Colion MacAdam 8, Butch Postma and Bruce Nicholson 4 each and Dave Forbes. Jim Whalen, Dave Connolly and Keeran Cortny also play-

ed but as yet have not broken the ice on the score sheet. High scorers for Smugglers were Gary Moore with 14 and J. Sutton hit 6 shots for 12 points.

## CONSUMERS BEWARE

Charlottetown - Island consumers should proceed with caution when dealing with firms or individuals who contact them by phone or at their door offering to supply and install insulation, storm windows, and/or siding for their homes, says Eric Goodwin, Director of Consumer Services.

Consumers are encouraged to contact the Division of Consumer Services to verify that the contractor is legally licensed to do business in the province and the holder of a valid direct seller's license, if necessary.

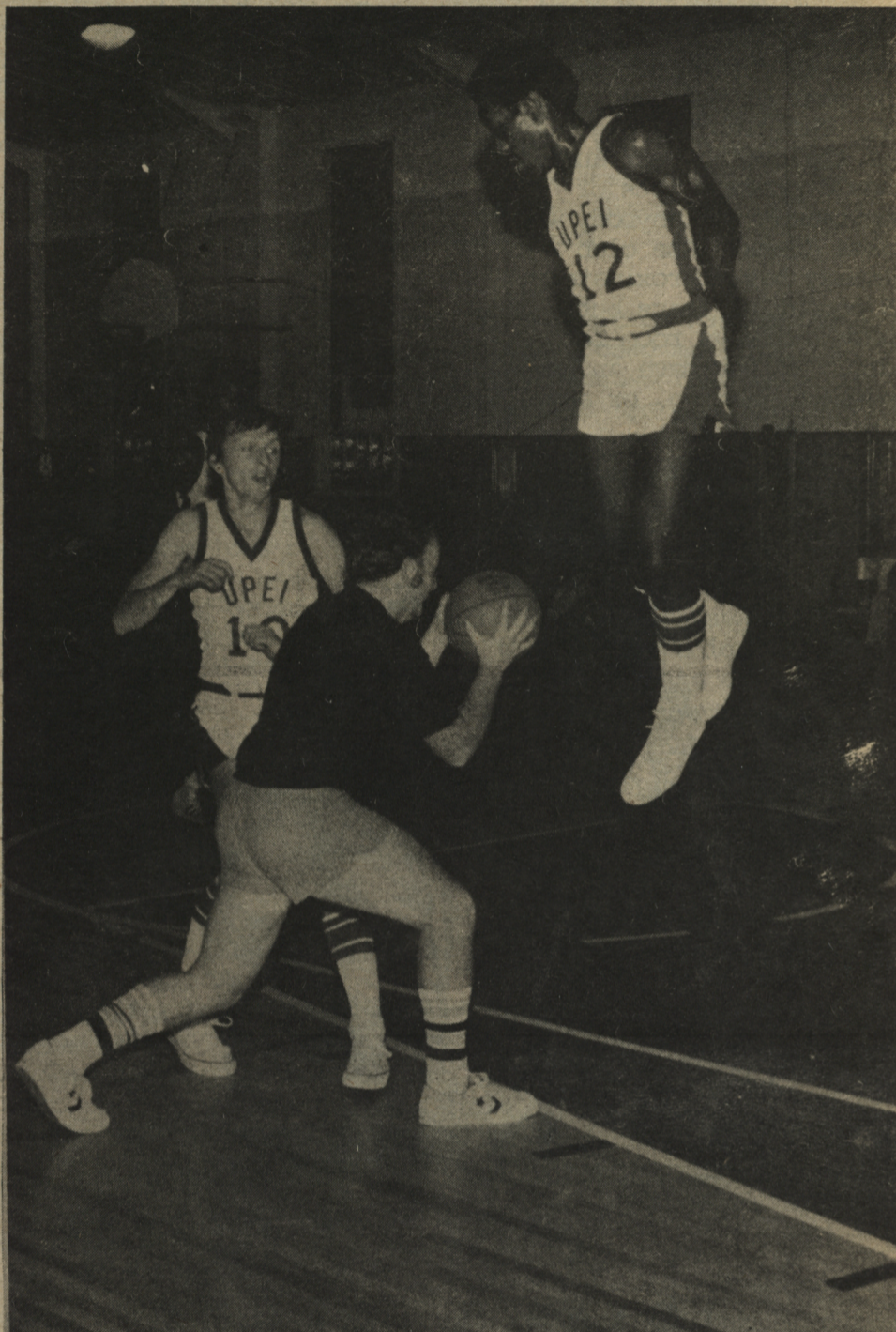
"There have been at least two non-resident contractors who have been active in the province over the summer and only now after some problems are arising have homeowners requested further information about these particular contractors. Consumers should, before engaging any contractor, obtain several

estimates and, if possible, names of former customers to be used as references," Mr. Goodwin said.

If signing a contract, it should specify commencement and completion dates, as well as a breakdown of material and labor. On completion, in order to protect oneself from a third party supplier registering a mechanics lien against your home, the consumer should hold back an amount equal to the cost of materials for a period of 60 days.

In the event that a third party supplier found it necessary to register a lien against the property in question for non-payment of materials, this holdback would be available to satisfy such a lien.

## SOUTH AFRICAN STUDENTS ARRESTED

PRETORIA (CUP) - In a swift move which erodes the few remnants of liberal democracy which still exist in South Africa, the South African government on Oct. 19 banned a host of anti-apartheid groups.

Justice Minister James Kruger closed the leading black newspaper, *The World*, outlawed 18 organizations and announced that between 50 and 70 people, mainly black activists, had been arrested in pre-dawn swoops across the country.

In addition, *The World's* editor, Percy Quoboza, was arrested.

Police said between 65

and 70 white students from the University of Witwatersrand were arrested last night after they marched from the campus to a post office intending to send a protest telegram to Mr. Kruger.

Among the more prominent of the banned organizations are: the Christian Institute, a multi-racial group of clergy and laymen opposed to South Africa's race policies, the Black People's Convention, the Soweto students' Movement, two national students organizations, as well as the Black Parents Association and the Union of Black Journalists.
