Potato Experiment

Tests which are scheduled to terminate about October 19 should prove of great interest to our farmers. They may determine whether or not the use of atomic energy could benefit the potato industry.

If gamma irradiation can be used successfully to enhance the keeping qualities and prolong the storage life of potatoes, it will enable them to be marketed at any time with a minimum of loss due to sprouting.

New Telephone Cable

Officials of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company have announced that a second telephone cable to link the North American Continent with Europe will soon be laid to supplement the one which was completed last year to connect London, Ottawa and New York.

The new line will provide 13 two-way circuits to France, 13 to Germany, 10 other circuits will be reserved for extension to other European countries.

According to the President of A. T. and T., as a result of the laying of the first cable, "in less than a year traffic to Great Britain has gone up 100 per cent and traffic to the continent 50 per cent."

Suppose a fire does break out in your home—what do you do? First call the fire department. Don't be bashful about it. Firemen would far rather tackle a small fire than a big one.

It is advisable to have a fire extinguisher handy and preferably push button, any position, operation type. Extinguisher should have a net capacity of 16 ozs. or more to extinguish incipient fires.

Every week some 1450 fires break out across Canada. Fire insurance safeguards your property, but only you can guarantee against loss of life.

I'd like to add a little fuel to the fire which is raging about the advantages and disadvantages of smoking. But I'm not going to talk about cancer. Instead, I'd like to discuss some other ailments in which excessive smoking apparently plays a part.

Chronic coughing, especially, has been alleviated in many instances simply by giving up smoking. Had chronic cough Two University of Virginia physicians carefully examined 25 patients with chronic cough and other respiratory disorders.

These persons had been fairly heavy smokers over a long period of time. They had smoked an average of 22 years and on 1.3 pack a day. Some smoked as many as 45 cigarettes each day.
