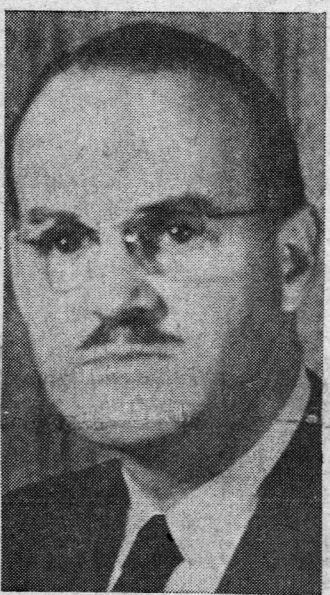


TRANSPORT MINISTER VISITS ISLAND
