MONTREAL (CP) - Industrials, banks and papers all had increases on index while utilities were unchanged during an active session Monday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.
Industrial climbed on the strength of solid gains in the steels and assorted sections. Papers were only moderately active and banks were generally firm all day.
Standard Structural hit a new high at 20, up 1, and Steel of Canada made 1 1/2 at 87 in an otherwise - quiet section. Only change in base metals at closing was in Noranda, off 1/2 at 45 1/2.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market continued to move higher Monday.
Base metals gained nearly three quarter points on index, while western oils gained a few decimal points. Golds dropped a decimal point.
Miners were quiet but among the senior issues International Nickel continued its winning ways from last week and gained 1 1/2 at 102 1/2. Senior uranium s were mixed. Algom was unchanged at 11 1/2. Gunnar lost five cents at \$9.60 and Consolidated Denison was off 10 cents at \$9.50.

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market made a slow advance Monday in the broadest trading since January. Some profit-taking blunted the upward movement near the close of trading.
A total of 1,286 issues were traded, the highest number since 1,275 were dealt in Jan. 22.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 50 cents to \$226.30.
Volume was 3,620,000 shares compared with Friday's 3,590,000. Except for Jones and Laughlin - up 1/4 - steels showed little change.

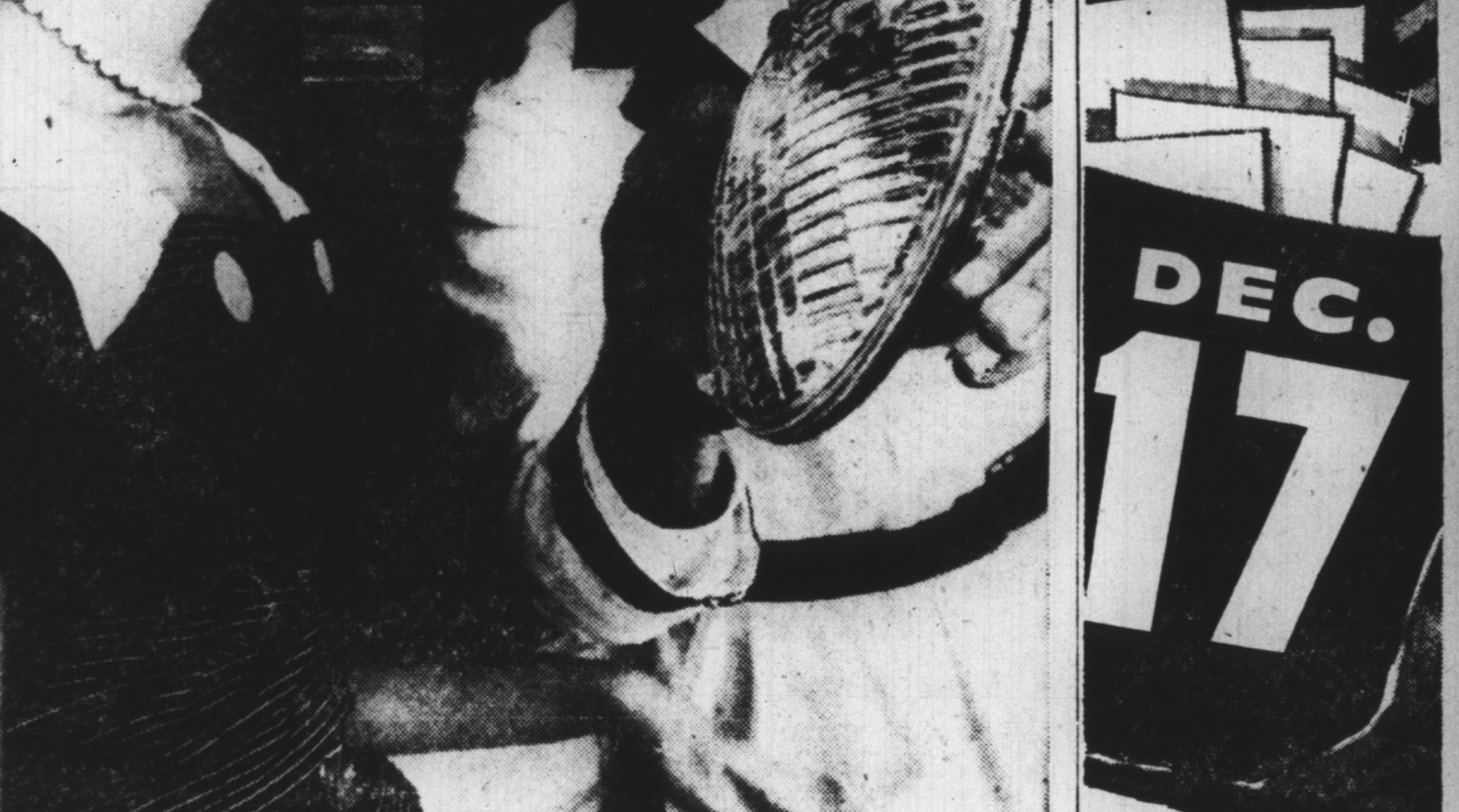
