Marketing Situation Is Described As Very Bad

The potato marketing situation was described as "very bad" last evening by H.B. Willis, the Island's largest grower and a veteran shipper. "The demand has slackened right off," said the man who two weeks ago, had seen a really good chance of the potato price hitting one dollar a bushel by mid-December.

The price right now is about 80 cents per bag to the grower and Mr. Willis doesn't see much chance of a change until mid-January. A lot will depend, he suggests, on how potatoes fare in storage in other competing potato zones.
Mr. Willis' look at market possibilities is not surprising after reading this week's release from F.W. Ward and Son, analysts that the December holdings report in Canada "is one of the heaviest on record."

Former Student Killed In Vietnam

A former St. Dunstan's engineering student who received his diploma in 1962, Second Lieutenant Roger Labouie, was killed in action in Vietnam while serving with the U.S. First Cavalry Division.

A native of Hildesford, Maine, he came to Saint Dunstan's in 1959 and after his graduation attended Nova Scotia Technical College, receiving his degree in engineering in 1964. In June of this year he graduated from an officers' training school in Virginia and then went to the war area.

Although no details of his death have been received it has been reported his body will be flown to his former home in Maine for burial.

Former Teacher In Who's Who

A staff member of the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana, Dr. John T. Croteau is listed in the recent edition of Who's Who in America.

Dr. Croteau is well known on Prince Edward Island. He was one of the guiding lights in the founding movement of credit unions and co-operatives, especially in this province. His advice was sought in these movements in various other parts of the Maritimes where he had many speaking engagements.

Dr. Croteau came to Prince Edward Island in the fall of 1953 and was the first teacher of sociology and economics at St. Dunstan's and Prince of Wales under a Carnegie Foundation grant.

His wife, who died several years ago, was the former Gertrude Gallant, sister of Mrs. (Dr.) G. L. Smith of Charlottetown.

solidation. He also disclosed that a director of guidance and special education has been appointed to assist in the recognized need for better education on the Island.

Dr. Frank MacKinnon, the guest speaker, brought out the changes which people must accept in order to further education. Dr. MacKinnon stated, "Our present educational system is almost at an end, and in the next few years we are going to see drastic changes. Education is a form of communications and human communications will be very different in a few years time. T. V., Teletext, the computer and other means of communication will bring a variety of top teachers into the classroom.

They will even be able to listen to Chinese, Indian, or Russian teachers because computers will soon provide instantaneous translations. Lessons may then be repeated again and again, a situation we cannot arrange today.

The present generation is rebelling, and rightly so, against adult conservatism in a Teletext age, and they want to discuss and argue and they want up-to-date quality."
